Workshop slated

Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, 1300 Mansfield St, Chippewa Falls, is hosting an ecumenical workshop in honor of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity on P.M. You are invited to come to an Introduction to Community Organizing as it is practiced by JONAH in the Chippewa Valley. JONAH (Joining Our Neighbors Advancing Hope) is a congregation-based organization that works for social justice.

The workshop will cover both the philosophy and the practice of community organizing. Organizing is about intentionally forming community, and it is about joining the voices of diverse people of faith to bring about real change. The workshop will include information about JONAH and its state umbrella organization, WISDOM. It will also include many opportunities for participants to interact and to share your hopes and visions with each other. The session will be led by David Liners, state director of WISDOM.

Financial Secretary Report/ Treasurer:

Income this month was \$17,202.49 expenses were \$11,063.77 leaving us with a November gain of \$6,138.72 and a check book balance of \$486.55. \$6500 of the reserve fund was transferred into the General Fund, along with a donation from the Women of Plymouth of \$3000.00. The lawn mowing bill was paid this month. \$998 was sent to St. Francis Food Pantry.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$3,714.67. We have \$765.00 in the Mission Fund, which we will transfer over to OCWM, since it appears we

will be short of our OCWM goal. That money was originally set aside for Care Link, which we are no longer doing.

Building Fund Report:

There was no report.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The kids sold \$40 worth of their craft items at the Bazaar. They have the curriculum set for the rest of the school year. The Christmas Pageant is Dec 21. The Council will host a punch and cookies reception for them after the service. There will be no Sunday School Dec 28 or Jan 4. They are sponsoring the confirmation trip to the Jesus Core Retreat at Pilgrim Center Jan 9–11.

Stewardship Commission:

The Stewardship campaign was an excellent program. Pledges seemed to be up a little.

Worship Commission:

We decorated the tree Dec 6. Christmas Eve service will be at 5 P.M. this year. The poinsettias will be coming in time for the Christmas Eve service.

Service Commission:

No report.

Building and Grounds:

Eau Claire Installation is set to start the repair work after Thanksgiving. Ron got bids from three different services. Since we needed the parking lot plowed before the council meeting he chose the least expensive, which was also a private party. He will be doing the snow removal of the drive way and parking lot only. Any shoveling or salting will have to be done by us. Jim changed the eye on the outside lights and now they are working properly.

Women of Plymouth:

They are giving Cyndi a \$1000 scholarship for her schooling. The Bazaar made a profit of around \$2500. They also funded the remaining portion of the money needed for the Gospellers who sang during worship.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David made 36 visits in November and had one funeral, for Bill Adams. Our website is finally listed in the ad in the Leader-Telegram. He purchased 2 more microphones and 3 mic stands from the Memorial Fund. Stewardship Sunday totals were \$48,347 from 21 pledges. The ecumenical worship service for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is Monday, January 19 at 7 P.M at Lake Street Methodist Church. Pastor David will be on vacation from Dec 25 thru January 2. Cyndi will lead worship on the 28. He will be with the confirmation class January 9-11 at the Jesus Core Retreat. Cyndi will also lead worship that Sunday. He also checked on the pledges still coming in for the

Building Fund, and there is approximately \$12,000 coming in yet from the pledges.

Nominating Committee Report:

The slate is full for next year, except for Moderator Elect. Larry will make an announcement next Sunday. Hopefully we will have a volunteer, and if not the spot will be open when it is brought to the annual meeting.

Mission Committee:

We served about 150 meals at the Community Table on November 29. Everyone agreed we should do again this summer. There will be pot luck January 4 and February 1. Kay will present her Cemetery talk during the February pot luck.

Listening Sessions:

Pastor David mentioned that Kathryn Hamilton is interested in working on this committee, so we decided to go forward with it, providing we can find a few more people interested in the idea.

New Business:

• The Personnel Committee still needs to meet for reviews. The annual meeting will be January 25.

Pastor David closed with a prayer.

Meeting adjourned 8:15 P.M.
