

Pastor's Pen

Dear Friends,

We brought four new members into our congregation on May 17 through confirmation of faith in an uplifting and beautiful worship service. Sam, Adam, Nathan, and Megan all were excellent worship leaders. Their statements of faith and scriptural testimonies were thoughtful, orthodox, and personal. As I mentioned on Sunday, a significant part of our UCC tradition, going back to the Puritans, is the belief in testimonies of faith, not tests of faith. Which is to say that each of us has the right and the responsibility to make our faith our own. But this is not purely individual—we do so within our faith community, challenging and edifying one another. This was a radical departure from Catholicism and the Church of England. It's what makes our denomination and tradition so vibrant and also makes it so difficult for others (especially the media) sometimes to understand the United

Church of Christ. I wouldn't trade it for anything, though! Our young members' diverse and thoughtful statements of faith (or we could call them testimonies of faith) are meaningful testimony to the way God's Holy Spirit moves differently in each of us.

We are also a denomination made up of Christians of all sorts of backgrounds. On that Sunday, Plymouth UCC consisted of confirmands from many traditions: 8 ELCA, 5 Missouri Synod Lutherans, 5 Presbyterians, 5 Methodists, 6 Catholic, 1 Reformed Church of America, 1 Christian Reformed, 1 Disciples of Christ, 6 United Church of Christ, and 6 who had been confirmed at Plymouth, plus a number of members baptized at Plymouth (or Second Congregational) before our church had confirmation. We are a big tent denomination and a big tent congregation, and I am thankful for it as I am thankful for the witness of our four newest members!

Everything you have taught and shared with me has been a part of who I am today. Nancy called the meeting to order and opened with devotions. The April Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Financial Secretary Report/ Treasurer:

Income this month was \$8,104.11, expenses were \$12,203.93 leaving us with an April loss of \$4,099.82 and a check book balance of \$3,992.79. Part of the income this month was \$1,180.00 from the Nut Fund. Large expenses this month were health insurance and retirement quarterly payments. We also paid St. Francis Food Pantry \$1,093.37. The current bank balance, as of May 9 is \$394.66. We had a deposit in the beginning of May of \$2,577.50 and \$930 from the thrift sale and a \$1,000 transfer from the Reserve Fund.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$5,665.69. Mimi has redone the report so we can keep better track of donations. The money in the undesignated and general fund areas will be used to offset some of the \$2,584.25 we had borrowed previously. Rob will also check on the service charge.

Building Fund Report:

No report

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

Confirmation will be May 17. There will also be a "reunion" of people who have been confirmed at Plymouth. There will be a short reception following worship.

Stewardship Commission:

The thrift sale results were \$970 for the general sale and \$300 for the bake sale. The results are down by about \$200 over last year, but we had very few large items this year. The Pie & Ice Cream Social is June 3 from 3:30 to 7. Many workers and pies are needed. The display case was discussed; they need to determine what is going in it, before they can set the size.

Worship Commission:

Helping with confirmation on May 17. On June 7, Christian Shufflin will become a member.

Service Commission:

They took the Mother's day gifts from the kids to the shut-ins.

Building and Grounds:

Yard clean up day will be May 30 from 9 A.M. until whenever. Someone has donated the money for the paint for the entry way, so that can be done. The company that put in our carpet in the Sanctuary is giving away free Red Oak saplings. We will contact them and tell them we would like one.

Women of Plymouth:

They have been working on getting people signed up for making pies for the Pie & Ice Cream Social.

WI Conference Meeting:

The annual meeting is June 12–14 in Green Lake and we need one more representative.

New Business:

- We have had a request to transfer membership for Cindy and Todd Konsella. Larry moved that we accept this transfer with regrets. Aurora seconded, motion passed.
- Mimi sent us a thank you note for the flowers we sent on Office Administrators Day.
- There will be a non-member wedding at the church on June 20. All the fees have already been paid. We will need a church member present, probably at about 1:30. Nancy mentioned we should review our building use policies. So everyone has a chance to look at them in the Leadership Manual, we will review next meeting.
- Nancy has cards for us all to sign for the Confirmation class.

• Pastor David has been approached by First Congregational whether we and Truax would like to join in raising funds for new equipment for the Community Table. Since our main focus is on St. Francis Food Pantry, it was suggested that we bring it up in the newsletter and maybe an announcement to give people an opportunity to donate if they would like, and not do any kind of an organized fund raising.

Pastor David closed with a prayer.
