### NW Association Pastor feels fulfillment as Military Chaplain

Serving as a US Army Reserve Chaplain is by far one of the more challenging journeys that I have ever embarked upon. Chaplains serve as a commissioned officer in the US military, a spiritual advisor for their Command, a subject matter expert in the area of religion and spirituality, and as a pastor to soldiers within their unit.



While the challenges may seem like many, it is more than worth it to serve our nation's service members. The most difficult part of the deployment has been the separation between my loved ones and me. However, I am discovering creative ways to nurture these relationships to foster growth and thrive through our deployment.

My days are often spent teaching classes (in resiliency and relationship maintenance) and offering pastoral counseling to service members struggling with combat, work, or home front related issues. Soldiers entering our Clinics receive care from well-trained professionals that teach appropriate life and coping skills. And we have therapists who assist them in finding meaningful and purposeful activities to address inward chaos they experience due to being in a combat environment. As a chaplain I challenge soldiers to remain resilient and strengthen their relationships during their time in theater. In Combat Operational Stress Control (COSC) the mental health and chaplain communities are working together to offer a holistic model of care. By merging psychology and spirituality within the military environment we are targeting all components of our service members' being: the physical, mental, and soul.

As we move towards closure in one area of this war, it is even more important that our nation and communities of faith continue with their support of our service members. These men and women who have answered the call to serve in defense of our nation's freedoms and interests need this support and care. I would like to personally thank the NW Association (and the churches within its jurisdiction) for the support and care offered to my unit and the soldiers we support here in Iraq. Thank you for helping us to offer some sense of normalcy in a demanding and chaotic environment. I pray that the Creator of the universe will bless our church and other faith communities as we minister to a generation of warriors who are transformed and broken by their time in combat. 

July 13, 2009

Nancy called the meeting to order and opened with devotions. The June Council minutes were reviewed. There were a couple spelling errors. The minutes were accepted as amended.

### **Financial Reports:**

### **Treasurer's Report:**

Income this month was \$9,501.61 and expenses were \$8,703.17, leaving us with a balance of \$74.72 Income included \$2,500 transferred from other accounts. Rob paid Health insurance of \$1,781.65. Lawn mowing still needs to be paid and OCWM has not been paid.

### **Memorial Fund Report:**

The balance for the end of the month is \$5,747.59. Designated monies of \$25 given for the Lowrys. We need to find out what they would like done with these monies.

### **Building Fund Report:**

Balance at the end of the month is \$28,339.99.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

### **Christian Education Commission:**

Kay reported that the Campers did an excellent job representing Plymouth Church. Good for them. Linda Jaenke and Kay have begun planning for VBS (Aug. 11–13). The theme is "Worms in the Bread" and they are planning for about 10 children. The first Family Movie Night was great fun. They had about 16 in attendance and look forward to the next two Movie Nights. They will meet Monday night to finalize Confirmation for this fall.

- Cyndi, our seminarian, needs to meet with her "anchor group" before September and back to school. She has also been encouraged to take one Sunday off per month to visit other

churches. Nancy will fill in as pianist. She will keep council posted of changes. Cyndi also reported she got all excellent in her courses this year.
