#### **Christena Strandt honored**



Pastor's Pen

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

On November 1, All Saints' Day, we will gather as Christ's people to remember and celebrate the lives of all the saints who have gone before, and specifically remember those from our congregation who have died in the last year. Martin Luther wrote that death is the completion of baptism. It is a thought I've been pondering since reading it last week in a book about historical Christian funeral practices and writings about death. Melinda Ann Quivik, the author of the book, is a pastor. She had a beautiful paragraph about death and the ashes Ash Wednesday:

"To contemplate Ash Wednesday is to consider the essence of Christian faith, for it takes us directly to the fundamental fears made null and void by the Risen One. Jesus' resurrection announces to us time and time again that...our dread...is not the last word in God's scheme of things. God's last word is resurrection. Our return to dust does not have to render us lifeless while we are yet living. Even the dust is held in the hands of the God who makes resurrection out of death, having defeated death once for all time."


On All Saints' Day we remember and celebrate of the faithful who have gone before us into the undiscovered country of eternal life. We will hear again the Good News of Easter's promise that death has lost its sting and we all have new life in Jesus Christ.

Nancy called the meeting to order and opened with devotional reading. The September Council minutes were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Financial Reports:**

Memorial Fund Balance	\$5,748.55

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Income this month was \$7973.60, expenses were \$9658.78, leaving us with September loss of \$1685.18 and a check book balance of \$60.24. Some larger expenses were the association dues, partial payment of the lawn mowing of \$400 and \$514.00 of the Food Pantry offering. The envelope giving is now down around \$5900. Rob hopes to pay more of the lawn mowing in October and some of the money that was collected for St. Francis. The Reserve Fund is now around \$4700.00 and that money will be used to pay those two items. We still have not paid any of our OCWM or special offerings to the Conference.

#### **Memorial Fund Report:**

The balance for the end of the month is \$5748.55. We still owe the Memorial Fund \$1772.35 from the General Fund. There is an undesignated amount in the Memorial Fund of \$30.00 which will be used to offset a little of the balance.

#### **Building Fund Report:**

No report

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Christian Education Commission:**

The Sunday School studied Communion for the month of September. On Oct. 4, the children baked the bread for communion. On Oct. 11, Pastor David had the blessing of the stuffed animals for them. Oct. 28 will be the annual "Halloween Spooktacular," everyone is invited. The time is 6-7:30 with a light supper being served. They will be making and selling crafts at the Bazaar again this year. The Youth class will meet Oct 25; a schedule will be given out. Oct. 18 is Children's Sabbath. Many of our youth will participate. Adult Ed continues with the study of Parables. Next will be the study of hymn tunes.

#### **Stewardship Commission:**

Larry and Pastor David showed us a design for the banner. They are asking her for a couple more designs. They are meeting with the curator at the Chippewa Valley Museum to get more information about an artifact case. They talked about the outstanding bills, and it was decided that we need to make sure the money for St. Francis goes out immediately. Stewardship Sunday will be December 6. There will be fewer mailings for that this year, but the same format. We can start ordering the mixed nuts. Larry asked that we think of people we can sell the nuts to in quantity. The costs are the same as last year; \$12 for the single box, \$20 for a double box and \$22 for the tins. He also had the coupon books for Younkers. They are \$5 each, and the entire \$5 goes to Plymouth, so the more we sell the more money we receive.

#### **Worship Commission:**

Advent decorating will be December 5. We have purchased oil candles, which should be in shortly. This is from Memorial money from Mary Stygar's sister.

#### **Building & Grounds:**

We will be doing the Christmas bags for St. Francis. The box for the school supplies will be out in Fellowship Hall. There is some feeling that we are having too many pot lucks, so we will cut out a couple during the year. We will start with the one in November, since we have a fairly busy month.

#### Copier:

We will be getting a new copier on Tuesday and will try to sell the old one. This will be quite a large savings, especially on the service contract.

#### **Moderator Elect:**

Since no one has come forward to volunteer for this position, the council has appointed Larry Kleist as Moderator-Elect. He has accepted.

Pastor David closed with a prayer.
