Larry called the meeting to order. The January Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Financial Secretary Report/ Treasurer:

Income this month was \$13,572.34; expenses were \$11,852.81 leaving us with January gain of \$1719.53 and a check book balance of \$1775.73. \$5000.00 was taken out of the Building Fund, leaving us with two more years to withdraw those funds. The quarterly payments on the property insurance, pension and health insurance were made. We collected \$225 for Haiti relief and that was sent to Madison. We also collected \$210 for St Francis, which was also sent.

Reserve Fund Report:

The Reserve Fund had income of \$472.00 in January so there is a balance of \$976.91 at the end of January.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$5952.83. The Welk memorial money was disbursed to Christian Ed.

Building Fund Report:

The balance for the end of January is \$26,383.81. \$5000 was withdrawn for the General Fund.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

Barb reported that the youth collected \$346.50 for the Souper Bowl of Caring on February 7. Proceeds are going to St Francis Food Pantry.

Stewardship Commission:

The first new banner will go up sometime in May. February 17 is the Ash Wednesday Potato Supper. They will once again have a thrift sale in May, so start collecting your goodies.

Worship Commission:

Barb reported the Ash Wednesday service will be on the 17th at 7 P.M. Lenten soup suppers and discussion will also be held again this year. They will be doing a kind of "Journey to the Cross." Each week we will discuss a different person and what their perspective of the crucifixion might be. George Stecher and Pastor David will be the leaders. Barb will take care of the soup. Pastor David is going to invite the Bloomer Church and Truax to join us. There will be no ecumenical noon Lenten services. This year there will only be one Easter Sunday Service. That service will be at 9:30, with the Magnificent

They are going to have a bake sale again during the church's thrift sale and possibly one during the April elections. Officers are Joanne Miller, secretary and Mary Stygar, treasurer. There is no president at this time, although Char will continue to report to the Executive Council.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David made 27 visits in January. He led worship at Heatherwood again on January 27. He is attending an all-day seminar on preaching the Gospel of Luke, which is in Chippewa Falls on Feb 23. The UCC has raised over \$650,000 for relief to Haiti. Over half of that amount has been raised online.

Other Business:

- ! Larry brought up the Easter ad and whether we should have one this year. It was agreed that we need to be in the newspaper for Easter. The cost is about \$97 which is just about the same as last year.
- ! We will also have a key made for the moderator and have him added to the key list.
- ! A member of the congregation questioned whether Pastor David should have a land line for a phone. The feeling is he is more accessible with the cell phone. Since his phone

number is not listed in the telephone book, it will be listed on the church's voice mail so that everyone can have access to it.
