Executive Council Minutes

April 12, 2010

Members present: Larry Kleist, Barb Kleist, Rob Jaenke, Aurora Bradbury-Schoening, Deb Zehms, Louise Partlow, Kay Stecher, Char Kozlowski and Pastor David Huber.

Larry called the meeting to order. The March Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$11,885.52; expenses were \$11,761.12 leaving us with March gain of \$124.40 and a check book balance of \$384.98. The quarterly payments of the pension of \$1716.63, the health insurance of \$1789.09, the building insurance of \$788.58 and the water bill of \$329.52 were all made. A \$3000.00 transfer from the Reserve Fund helped us to make these bills. As of the end of March our envelope giving was up about \$3200.00. We also collected \$345 for The One Great Hour of Sharing and \$570.00 for the food pantry and those amounts have been forwarded on, also.

Reserve Fund Report:

The Reserve Fund has a balance of about \$2800.00 at the end of March. There was a PIP interest deposit of around \$4500 and a withdrawal to the General Fund of \$3000.00.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$6128.80. There was a General Fund donation of \$600 which was used to offset the balance owed to the Memorial Fund by the General Fund.

Building Fund Report:

We have a check book balance of \$2295.20 and a savings account balance of \$24156.92. Louise will close out the checking account, since we have no need for that any more. The money from that will be deposited in the savings account.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The Magnificent Muffin breakfast was a success. \$420 was raised to help our campers go to Moon Beach. They have also raised \$70 from the film festival in February and \$100 in the sale of candy bars. The rest of the money for the campers will come from the Mary Lou Welk memorial fund. On May 9, we will celebrate the Festival of the Christian Home. The Sunday School kids will have gifts for Moms and Dads. They will be attending a conference at First Congregational Church on April 17 called "Imagine! The Art of Faith Formation."

Stewardship Commission:

The all-church thrift sale will be April 30 and May 1. We need people to work Friday and Saturday and lots of marked items. Sign up sheets are up at church. The first new banner will be dedicated on May 9. Rev. Wanda Veldman, who is the maker of the banner, will also be our guest preacher that day. They are working on the artifact case. The builder who will be making it is tied up till summer, so it will be a little while yet. The Pie & Ice Cream Social will be June 9, one week after Truax has theirs. Stewardship has decided that they will take an offering the 3rd Sunday of each month for OCWM, much like we do for St Francis. Larry was wondering if there would be any interest from our shut in's on receiving a CD of the sermon. The question was raised whether they would know how to operate a CD player. They will look into the costs and whether it is feasible.

Worship Commission:

The Easter Service was well attended. The change in time also didn't seem to affect the Muffin breakfast. There was a small attendance at the Maundy Thursday Service, but as usual it was a very meaningful service. The Wednesday evening Lenten discussions and suppers were well attended.

Service Commission:

Building and Grounds:

Jim will check on the couple of roof leaks that we have. The spring clean up day was set for May 15 at 9:00 A.M.

Women of Plymouth:

They will now be meeting every 4 months and have no official board. Dorothy Kruscke will still take care of the kitchen, Mary Stygar will be treasurer, Joanne Miller will be secretary and Char Kozlowski will report to the Executive Council. Mary and Joanne will also work together on funerals. They will be having another bake sale along with the church's thrift sale.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David made 47 visits in March. He led worship at Heatherwood again. He will be leading worship at a Christian Ed. event at First Congregational on April 17. The Northwest Association meeting is April 24 at First Congregational. We still need a delegate for that meeting. The Wisconsin Conference annual meeting is June 11–13. We need another delegate for that, also. Pastor David will be directing MADD camp June 21–27, and will need to go up on June 20. He will also be gone May 17–21 on a study leave, attending the Homiletics Festival in Nashville. On the National UCC news front, as of March 31, UCC giving to relief in Haiti has reached \$2.1 million.

Other Business:

- Professional Administrators week is April 19–23. Barb will take care of that.
