Just a reminder ...

Beginning July 17, 2010 you will need to dial the area code even for local calls. To ensure a continuing supply of telephone numbers, area code 534 has been added (overlaid) to the geographic region now covered by 715 alone. You should begin using the new procedure now whenever you place local calls from the 715 area code. Just dial all 10 digits (area code + 7-digit telephone number) for every local call. If you forget the area code, the call will still go through until July 17. After that, the call will not be completed, and a recording will provide instructions on how to redial your call. If you have questions regarding the now dialing procedure, please call the Public Service Commission at 1-800-331-0500.

Dear Friends and Family of Plymouth,



Financial Reports:

As of May 31, 2010 Year to Date Income \$47,836.45 Year to Date Expenses \$47,138.22 Ahead (Behind) \$653.23 Building Fund Balance \$26,452.16 Memorial Fund Balance \$5,729.76

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$9236.84; expenses were \$8167.98 leaving us with May gain of \$709.43. This includes Thrift Sale monies of \$1388.78. OCWM monies of \$308 were paid and \$246 for the St. Francis Food Pantry.

Building Fund Report:

Balance \$26,452.16 (.04 interest on checking before closing)

Working on new Funeral and Building Use proposal. Will discuss at next meeting. Larry has the proposal.


Pastor's Report:

Before we had clocks and watches, people told time with sundials. Make a sundial to tell the time.

You will need:

- * a stick about a foot long
- * a permanent marker
- * a watch
- * 10 or 12 small wooden stakes (Popsicle sticks or tongue depressors work well.)
- * a bright, sunny day


How to make it:

- 1. Choose a sunny area outside.
- 2. Place the stick in the ground.
- 3. When your watch is on the hour (ex. 1:00, 2:00, etc.), place a small stake at the end of the shadow made by the stick. Write the time on the stick with the marker.
- 4. After an hour has passed, put another stake in the ground where the shadow is now. Write the new time
- 5. Continue this way throughout the day.

You now have a sundial!

How to read the time:

See where the shadow of the stick points. If it points to a stake the time is the time written on the stake. If the shadow is halfway between two stakes,
