November 8, 2010

Larry called the meeting to order. The October Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$7723.04; expenses were \$7695.82 leaving us with an October gain of \$27.22 and a check book balance of \$35.50. Envelope giving is still up \$5865 as of last September. Bills paid this month were the August and September lawn mowing \$400.00. We also paid St. Francis \$227.00 and the Neighbors in Need offering of \$201.00. Part of the income for this month was a \$1000.00 withdrawal from the Reserve Fund.

Reserve Fund Report:

The Reserve Fund has a balance of \$688.70 at the end of October. There will be a deposit in November of about \$1275.00.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$5653.34.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of September was \$26,583.25. Since there were no further deposits or interest in October, the balance remains the same.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The All Church Halloween party was Wednesday, October 27. There were 23 people in attendance. The children have been making crafts for the Bazaar in November. This is their Stewardship lesson. They will also make center pieces for the Thanksgiving Eve reception after the service.



Stewardship Commission:

They are putting the Stewardship campaign together; it will have the same format as last year. We should have the Advent banner in time to decorate for Advent. The nuts are here and will be sold at the Bazaar. They have found someone to build the artifact case. Younkers Coupon books for Community Days on the 13th of November are for sale for \$5, all proceeds go to Plymouth from those we sell.

Service Commission:

The Commission is making visits and keeping up with the progress of members who are recovering from illness.

Building and Grounds:

Someone will be coming soon to take down the dead pine tree in the front and the one that fell over in back of the kitchen area. The front lights and driveway lights should be on at night now. BJ Stygar is working on fixing the lawn mower and has volunteered to cut the grass next summer. Rob's Dad has volunteered to paint the Fellowship Hall for the cost of the supplies needed.

Women of Plymouth:

The bake sale was successful. The Bazaar is November 13. They will be paying for the carpet to be cleaned in Fellowship Hall and the balance of the bill due for the Pot Luck Cook Book.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David made 34 visits in October. He officiated at two weddings, Gina Javrek & Kyle Smith, and Randy Shepler & Nancy Kollwitz. He led worship at Heatherwood on October 20. Our facebook fan page is up and running, thanks to George Stecher. The Thanksgiving Eve Service is here on November 24 at 7 P.M. The choir from First Congregational will sing. Moon Beach suffered a 4-day loss of power in the late October storms. They are up and running again, but

lost a lot of trees. The UCC Communications office is putting together a musical Christmas special that will air on NBC in December.

Other Business:

- The committee is getting together to work on the All Inclusive proposal.
- We have collected about \$265 for Cyndi Bradbury's trip; Pastor David will make another announcement in December and put something in the newsletter. We also have the \$50 we voted on from the church and the Women of Plymouth stated that they will make up whatever the difference is.
- Deb is working on the nominating committee.
