PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

Christmas blessings and New Year hopes to you at this time!

Over the course of 2010, Plymouth United Church of Christ has come together many times to be Christ's church in action in Eau Claire and in the world. Not only for Sunday and occasional other worship services, but the thrift sale, Pie and Ice Cream Social, Holiday Bazaar, clean-up days, plus giving \$3,625.40 to St. Francis Food Pantry and \$2,677.50 to other special offerings, and more! We are truly the church in all these times. Two recent events stand out as particular examples of Plymouth serving one another and our community in Christian love.

The first was just a few weeks ago at Jeanne Zehms' memorial service, which was held on our record-breaking snow day. Some of you braved the storm to set up the fellowship room and then later to serve lunch. Some of you came in to help move snow from the sidewalks. After the funeral I was especially moved to see so many of you stay to help snowblow paths in the parking lot, scrape ice off cars, and continue to shovel to ensure that all who came here could get out of our parking lot as safely as possible.

The second happened in worship on Sunday, Dec. 19. I told you about a woman who called the church looking for some help so she could have some Christmas presents for her teenage children, and all they were asking for was clothing and bedding. You gave \$130 for her. I took her shopping on

Monday. We not only made sure her children would have Christmas gifts, but built a relationship and showed God's love working through you to someone in our community. Jesus said, "Whatsoever you do to the least of these, you do to me."

One mark of a Christian is that we are people who do things that we don't necessarily have to do. No one *had* to help after the memorial service (or help doing anything at any of them), and no one *had* to offer your money to help a family in need. But as we are loved by God, we love others, even when it seems crazy or wasteful or risky.

This church lives as faithful disciples of Jesus. For your generosity, your Christian love, your fellowship and your giving of time and talent to Plymouth and to Jesus Christ, whose birth we celebrate, I give God great thanks and give thanks to you all as well!

Larry called the meeting to order. The November Council minutes were reviewed and approved with one correction regarding the month paid for the lawn mowing; it should have read August.

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$6813.04; expenses were \$6630.15 leaving us with a November gain of \$182.89 and a check book balance of \$218.39. Envelope giving is still up \$4800 as of last November. Bills needing to be paid yet are \$700 lawn mowing bill and the money to the food pantry and OCWM which was not paid out. There will be a large snow removal bill coming in December. Part of the income for this month was a \$1000.00 withdrawal from the Reserve Fund.

Reserve Fund Report:

The Reserve Fund has a balance of \$1500 at the end of November.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$7328.34. There were deposits of \$1677.50, mostly from Jerry Lowry's

memorial. The rest of the Lenore Tubbs memorial will go to a third banner for Lent and then for nursery flooring.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of September was \$26,583.25, since there were no further deposits or interest in November, the balance remains the same.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

Kay reported that they missed the first practice for the Christmas program due to the snow storm. After the program they will take a two week break and resume on January 9. They sent the first half of the year's offering to St. Francis.



Larry reported they are working on the budget and we will approve in January. The nut sale is over; all nuts were sold. For the first batch of pledges for the year, we have about \$44,000 pledged. Last year we had a total of \$64,000 pledged. There will be more pledges coming in during December.

Service Commission:

No report.
