PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends and Family of Plymouth,

Thank you all for your continuing generosity to Plymouth and to the many missions of the United Church of Christ! Though we are in a bit of a financial difficulty right now, you continue to step up and offer of your resources. We just received a letter of thanks from Susan Sanders, Administrator of One Great Hour of Sharing, thanking Plymouth for two donations that were given: \$50.00 for the UCC Spring Storms USA Appeal Relief Fund, and \$111.00 for relief efforts in Japan. These are gifts that came from your hearts, as we did not organize specific offerings around either of these issues. Susan writes in her letter to us some of the things they are doing or dealing with: "Six states have been severely impacted by flooding, with more states likely to reach emergency status due to rain fall and already high lake, river, and creek levels. In addition to floods, more than 150 tornadoes have swept across the mid-section and southeast United States, in what authorities describe as the worst-single stretch of tornadoes in more than four decades... states hit hardest are Alabama, Mississippi, Georgia, Missouri, Tennessee, North Carolina, and North Dakota."

She goes on to say that the United Church of Christ's immediate response included providing safety equipment to homeowners and volunteers cleaning up damaged homes. So, thank you for your generosity to these two special appeals, and to all that you give to Plymouth and the UCC, and through them, give to Jesus, who said "Whatsoever you do for the least of these, you do for me."
