those who will be doing the 3 mile walk will go on with that and the bikers will pick up their bikes and continue on their ride. This is a major fund raiser for the Feed My People Food Bank in Eau Claire. Twenty-five percent of what is raised in the walk stays here and goes to the food bank. The rest goes to help people around the world and in the USA.

Last year the money raised on the walk bought over 23,000 meals in the Eau Claire area. Feed My People supplies food to the area food banks, including St. Francis Food Pantry. SCRIP now from Mega *and* Gordy's

For the last several months, some members of Plymouth Church have been participating in the Scrip program. It began with Mega and is now available for Gordy's as well. It is a painless, cost-free fundraiser for our church. Here is how it works: On Sunday, you fill out a form requesting Scrip cards for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. You pay for the cards when you order, with cash or check made out to Plymouth. We are able to keep 3% of the money that is paid for the cards, and pay Mega or Gordy's the remaining amount. So, if you buy a \$100 card, we pay \$97 and keep \$3 to help pay our bills. The next Sunday, your gift cards will be waiting for you at church to spend at Mega, Mega Holiday, Gordy's or Gordy's gas at their full value. They work just like cash, so if you use them to buy gas, you get that cash discount and help the church at the same time!

This is a fundraiser that costs you nothing, requires almost no effort on your part, and can save you money. From May through August, we have earned \$215.25. We hope that more members of the church will be willing and able to participate in this ongoing fundraiser. If you are a shopper at Festival, and would be willing to buy Scrip cards for that location, please let Larry Kleist know this.

Scrip order forms are on the table by the entrance to the sanctuary. See Larry or Deb Zehms if you would like help with your order form. Please consider buying Scrip. What an easy way to help our church pay the bills!

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MINUTES September 12, 2011

Deb called the meeting to order. The August Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$5940.75, expenses were \$6361.60; leaving us with a August loss of \$420.85 and a check book balance of \$176.24. \$1000.00 was transferred from the Reserve fund. \$59.25 was deposited from the Mega SCRIP cards. Envelope giving is down approximately \$6000 year-to-date compared to 2010.

Reserve Fund Report:

Balance of \$599.00 at the end of August.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the August is \$4,125.69.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of July was \$15,759.26.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

We are getting ready for Rally Day on Sept. 18. Sunday School begins for both youth and adults at 9:15 A.M. During worship time we will have a "Blessing of the Backpacks" for all of our students and teachers.

Stewardship Commission:

Larry reported that the Mega SCRIP cards seem to be working well. We made \$59.25 this month, \$215.25 year-to-date. SCRIP has now been set up for Gordy's as well. The goal is to make \$1000 in the first year. They are discussing new ideas for a Stewardship Campaign. The red letter sent out was not as effective previous years.

Worship Commission:

Barb reported that the outdoor worship was amazing! Rally Day will be Sept. 18, and include the Blessing of the Backpacks with a potluck following. They are planning to rearrange the front of the sanctuary and asked for opinions on the current chair set-up, which was favorable.

Service Commission:

We will continue to announce the new cards for the Service Commission record keeping. This helps us keep track of which shut-ins are being visited by members of the congregation, so that we can be sure no one is missed. Discussed setting up an email notification/caller tree for when people are in the hospital/need prayers. The lists would only be notified with the person's permission.

Char reported that they met to start working on the Bazaar, which will be Nov. 12. The greeting cards will also be re-stocked soon.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David thanked everyone for the vacation. The Wednesday outdoor worship was a lot of fun, and looking forward to having more people next year. Yuki will be arriving and there will be a reception at the church Thurs. Sept. 22 for everyone who would like to welcome and meet her.

Other Business:

- The Nominating committee is starting again. Anyone interested in being involved in a commission or committee should contact a member of the council.
- Community Table will be October 1, and we need to raise \$100 for the offering.
- Crop Walk is October 9, and we need walkers. You can walk either the 1 or 3 miles; there is also an 8 mile bike option this year.

- We received a letter that the wooded lot needs to be tidied where it is dropping on neighbors' lawns.
- We are looking at fixing the electricity to the lighting for the current sign vs. installing a new lit sign.
- Paul from First Congregational UCC visited and is part of a team there that would like to set up some interviews with both Plymouth and Truax to see if there are any joint community concerns we could all work on together. They are hosting an "Act Out Our Faith" event on November 12, 9am–12pm and we are all invited.
