EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MINUTES November 14, 2011

Deb called the meeting to order. The October Council minutes were not available.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$12,781.55, expenses were \$12,788.32; leaving us with an October loss of \$6.77 and a check book balance of \$8.86. \$1,000.00 was transferred from the Women of Plymouth; \$5,000.00 from the Building Fund. Quarterly insurance and retirement payments were made, as well as OCWM and St. Francis Food Pantry.

Reserve Fund Report:

Balance of \$1169.35 at the end of October.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of the month is \$4,126.38.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of October was \$10.870.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The Sunday School kids made crafts and sold them at the Bazaar. Great job! The Halloween party was a big success with 25–30 attending. Thanks to all who helped plan and produce, and thanks to those who participated. There will be no Sunday School for children or adults on Nov. 27, Dec. 25, or Jan. 1 for holiday breaks. The annual Christmas program will be on December 18 during worship. Also a request was placed to the Nominating Committee to replace Aurora when she moves.



Stewardship Commission:

Larry reported our financial situation is not good, but some ideas were brought up at the congregational meeting on Nov.13 that may help (please see notes in newsletter). The second letter that Deb mailed out seems to have helped some. The Fancy Mixed Nuts fundraiser has raised \$1,029. Another business/bulk account for the nuts would be helpful if anyone has an idea for someone who would be interested.

Worship Commission:

Barb reported that the Thanksgiving Eve worship service will be on Wednesday, Nov. 23 at First Congregational United Church of Christ, with Pastor David leading the service. Six people were honored on All Souls' Day. Advent starts the last Sunday of November. Christmas decorating will take place Dec. 3.

Everyone is invited to help starting at 10 A.M., and there will be a soup lunch served. Christmas Eve service will be at 5 P.M., Christmas Day service will be at the usual Sunday time, 10:30 A.M.

Service Commission:

We will continue to announce the new cards for the Service Commission record keeping. This helps us keep track of which shut-ins are being visited by members of the congregation, so that we can be sure no one is missed.

Building and Grounds:

It has been decided to discontinue the lawn mowing service next summer to save money. There will be a rotation using a mower owned by the church. Thank you to Jim getting the roof heat tapes ready for winter. We are using a new snow removal company this year that is a better price than last year, but the bid does not include sidewalks. Jim said he would take care of the sidewalk clearing, with the help of a few extra people if he is not able to make it.

Women of Plymouth:

Char reported that the Annual Bazaar was a success, with \$2,418 raised, up \$300 from last year! Thank you to everyone who helped.

Other Business:

 Discussed having a "no guns" sign for front of church. We were unsure if this would create liability or not, so we decided to wait and see if it is necessary.

- Discussed ideas for fundraising from congregational meeting. Another meeting will be announced soon to review, and the ideas will be printed in the newsletter.
- Louise will be taking over the Secretary position from Aurora. The next Executive Council meeting will be moved to Dec. 5. A very nice farewell was given to Aurora.

Income includes \$1,000 from Women of Plymouth and \$5,000 transferred from the Building Fund. Quarterly insurance and retirement payments were made. \$1,400 for July-Oct lawn mowing was paid, and finished for the year. \$276 for OCWM and \$231 for OCWM-Neighbors in Need were paid. \$884 was paid to St. Francis Food Pantry.

Envelope giving is down approximately \$7,400.00 YTD compared to 2010.

On November 13, we had a congregational meeting to generate ideas for reducing expenses and additional fundraising. I would like to thank all who attended. It was an excellent meeting with much input from many people.

Please read over the list of ideas at the end of this note. Do you have any information on any of the items listed that would help us in making the decision to move forward with or eliminate the suggestion? Do you have other ideas? Feel free to contact me, or any member of the Executive Council with your thoughts. We will discuss these ideas further at our next congregational meeting, when we approve the budget and vote on our Executive Council for 2012.

- Check into the possibility of locating a cell tower or Clearwire tower here.
- Finding a Daycare that would want to locate here. Is there a central site where we could put our offer so it could be seen by potential "clients?"
- Or...an exercise group, small church without a home, 4-H, other purposes?
 Could we put this offer on our website?
- Work Pepsi wagon/brat stands by groceries during the summer.
- Work at other events: Country Jam, Air Show...others?
- Do the mowing ourselves on a rotation basis. Rob, George, and Keith volunteered. If we get one or two more, that would then be just once a month for each...not such a burden.

- It looks like our snowplowing bill will be reduced...except we need the sidewalks done. Who can we find?
- Bring back the auction.
- Have a thrift sale in winter, perhaps include a bake sale. Perhaps some items could be auctioned as well.
- Can we start up the e-Bay project again? How do we find a person like the one we had before? (quilt?)
- Does it make sense to go back to the silent auction idea for the bazaar, or at any of our events?
- It was noted that our nut sales make as much money, or nearly, that other much more labor intensive fund raisers do. Can we learn from that as we proceed?
- How about a beer/wine tasting event, or some sort of a more classy, ethnic, gourmet eating event?
- Caroling. We could get a group to go to shut ins, church friends, area nursing homes...whatever. This could be for camaraderie or, depending on where you go, a fundraiser. Could also just be a way to get us/our name out there depending on where we go. In any event, it would be lots of fun.
- Chicken Q. The company takes care of all the cooking. We would need servers only. Not a lot of labor.
- Signing up at area businesses for their percentage back program for Tuesdays.
 Culvers, Dairy Queen (I think our school does this one...I'll check.)
- Concessions at Predator games and others at Carson Park...shorter time than the brat stands.
- Do we get money if we host a blood drive?
- Would it pay to try to sell the nuts outside of stores? Maybe at the fall/winter farmer's market (or baked goods for that). Cost of having a booth, need a commercial kitchen?

Stewardship Moment

You have all heard the expression—Pay Yourself First. Maybe we should adopt that slogan for Plymouth church. We are all part of this church—it is "our" church, so let's pay ourselves first with our pledges. Our pledges help pay for our church's upkeep, its programs, and its mission.

I remember many years ago there was a special drive for a building fund. One of many over the years! A member of the Board of Trustees made a home call one evening and he actually suggested an amount he would like for us to pledge. I remember thinking "he's got to be out of his mind." But, I also remember, after thinking it over, we did make that pledge. I also remember the feeling of satisfaction when that pledge was paid. It is a good feeling to pay yourself first.

Plymouth church is in a financial slump right now. We don't have enough money coming in to meet our expenses. Our Stewardship Commission is beginning its pledge campaign for funds for the coming year. It would be nice if you were to consider a "you've got to be out of your mind" kind of pledge this year. But, if you can't do that, how about the suggestion in the recent stewardship letter that we all increase our pledge by 10%. That would smooth out our financial situation. Increase your pledge by a mere 10%. That's what I am going to do and I hope you will help by doing the same. Let's "Pay Ourselves First."
