Don't forget your SCRIP cards!

SCRIP cards are now available for Mega and Gordy's. It is a painless, cost-free fundraiser for our church. Here is how it works: On Sunday, you fill out a form requesting Scrip cards for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. You pay for the cards when you order, with cash or check made out to Plymouth. We are able to keep 3% of the money that is paid for the cards, and pay Mega or Gordy's the remaining amount. So, if you buy a \$100 card, we pay \$97 and keep \$3 to help pay our bills. The next Sunday, your gift cards will be waiting for you at church to spend at Mega, Mega Holiday, Gordy's or Gordy's gas at their full value. They work just like cash, so if you use them to buy gas, you get that cash discount and help the church at the same time!

PASTOR'S PEN



Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Four of your church leaders (George and Kay Stecher, Darrick Carter, and I) have begun a six-month process of reading, conversations, and guidance from a trained leader about church vitality and renewal. We and twelve other congregations began on January 21 with a seminar at our conference office in DeForest. Our team will meet with our trainer about once a month through June.

We are reading a book called "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations" (Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity) and exploring how to integrate them into Plymouth's life. You will hear more from us in the newsletter and sermons as we go through this process. We are not looking to make drastic or major changes. We have found ways that work very well for us and that fit us well. We will not do away with any of that. We do expect to learn how to do some things better and maybe add a few things that will enhance who we already are to make us a more vibrant congregation that people notice and want to be part of.

One practice we have added already I mentioned in my sermon on January 22—praying for Plymouth in the Prayers of the People. I ask you to keep Plymouth in your daily prayers as well. Darrick will soon (probably starting in Lent) offer time on Sunday mornings for people to gather to pray for Plymouth, our leaders, and our ministry to Eau Claire and the world beyond. Stay tuned

on the church website, facebook page, and Sunday bulletin/announcements for more details on that and some sample prayers.

Two practices we can begin immediately relate to hospitality (which we do very well already, by the way). The first is to be more intentional about wearing our name tags on Sunday mornings. The second is cookies. Our presenter on Saturday told us how important they are. Many of you remember the importance of someone coming to your door with a plate full of cookies. If you would like to make cookies or would enjoy taking them to the homes of our visitors, please let me know, and we'll start that as soon as possible.

Lastly, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday supper and worship on February 22. On the following Wednesday night we will continue our tradition of a soup supper followed by a worship/discussion time. This year we are exploring the Lord's Prayer. It should be quite enjoyable and spiritually enriching! Our discussions are always lively, and I know that I learn much from them. Please plan to join us.

Treasurer's Report:

Income this month was \$9,018.72, expenses were \$10,236.99; leaving us with a December loss of \$1,218.27 and a check book balance of \$5.27. \$1,300.00 was transferred from the Reserve Fund to end the year with a positive balance in the checking account. Monies for the Food Pantry and OCWM were paid out.

Reserve Fund Report:

Balance of \$2,265.50 at the end of 2011.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of November is \$5.859.98.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of November was \$10,827.58.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

The annual Christmas pageant, on December 18, went very well! Many thanks to Travis Eisberner, John Stecher, Carter Jaenke, and Morgan Jaenke for their beautiful recreation of the nativity. Camp registration is online. Plymouth kids will go the last week in June.

Stewardship Commission:

Pledges for 2012 are \$6,000 more than last year. Last year was \$54,000 and this year is approximately \$60,000. Hopefully we will be able to repay the Building Fund.



Worship Commission:

Christmas decorating and Christmas Eve went well. Wednesday, January 11 at 6:30 P.M. we will take down decorations. February 22 is Ash Wednesday and a decision will be made as to whether to do the Baked Potato Dinner or just soup and salad that evening.
