Balance as of 3/31/12 was \$2,203.28. Deposits in March totaled \$3,860.61. \$2,000 was transferred to General Fund in March.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance for the end of March is \$4.190.87.

Building Fund Report:

The balance at the end of March (First Quarter) was \$10,847.91. That included interest income of \$20.33.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Christian Education Commission:

Easter Sunday's "Magnificent Muffin Morning" breakfast was another great success! We collected \$540 in donations to help our Moon Beach campers! THANK YOU to all who baked, set up, cleaned up, and ate on a beautiful Easter morning. April 22 has been designated as "Youth Sunday" at Plymouth. May 20 will be a day of recognition for our Christian educators and all students graduating this spring.
