PASTOR'S PEN

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

I write this to you from the front porch of my cabin at beautiful Moon Beach on a sunny Monday morning with a glorious view of the lake. I am here with six of our children and youth—together we make a bit more than ten percent of this week's camp attendance! I am so very thankful that you all support our children and youth to go to camp and have some life changing and faith building experiences, and that you also are willing to send your pastor out to do ministry within the greater church by taking part in the camping ministry. I also want to say thank you for all your giving to Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM)—about half of our OCWM giving stays in the Wisconsin Conference, and a portion of that giving (about \$100,000 each year) goes directly to our two camps.

The following are some random bits of news and information.

Our seminarian, Cyndi Bradbury, graduated from United Theological Seminary in May, and we had a celebration party for her in early June. Her next step is to write her ordination paper and when that is approved (I will write more on that another time), she can search for a call and then be ordained! So please send your congratulations to Cyndi.

Last Tuesday, when it was blisteringly hot out, Mike Henry, George Stecher, and I went out to do some street ministry handing out bottled water and snacks to homeless folks and others who needed it. We spent some time at Community Table and then headed downtown, and gave away about two cases of water and many bags of cookies and candy. But even more importantly, we listened to people's stories. Everyone has a story, but many of the mentally ill, homeless, or poor don't have much opportunity to tell theirs. And the people who need to hear those stories too often ignore them or are not in a place to

hear them. It was one of those things that truly make us the church, and we (as a congregation) will do more of this. If you are interested in doing something like this, please talk to Mike or me. To use some of the phrases we have learned from our Five Practices of a Fruitful Congregational, street ministry like we did last Tuesday is intentional faith development through risk taking mission and service. Plymouth was very well served last week, as were many of God's children, including a woman we found who was severely dehydrated and malnourished.

Our very own Charline Kozlowski is heading off for another trip to Germany to offer her ministry of song as part of the Wisconsin Conference Gospel Choir. She did this a few years ago, and they are going again this August for almost two weeks of sharing their music in many churches, and singing with other Gospel choirs in the area. For some reason, American Gospel Music is incredibly popular in Germany, which they sing in English to keep it authentic. Please offer your prayers for safe travel and fruitful ministry as Charline and the rest of the choir act as ambassadors of Wisconsin and of the Wisconsin Conference UCC! The trip is August 7–22.

Lastly, our pianist Lynn and I are going to Pilgrim Center (our other camp) at the end of July for a retreat about church music. We attended this last year and learned a lot about contemporary music, worship, and liturgy in the progressive church. We came back very energized last year, and expect to return this year having learned even more with more new music to offer to you all!
