Barb called the meeting to order at 7:00. The November minutes were read and then approved.

Financial Reports:

As of November 30, 2012 Year to Date Income \$96,921.14 Year to Date Expenses \$96,928.09 Ahead (Behind) \$(\$6.95)

Treasurer's Report:

Income for November was \$5,705.23; expenses were \$5,832.38 for a loss of (\$1.68). Giving was down in November. Scrip card income is approximately \$1,000. Nut sales were approximately \$1,100. Pledges received so far compare with last year at this time.

Reserve Fund Report:

The balance at the end of November was \$300.49.

Memorial Fund Report:

The Memorial Fund balance is \$4,802.10 at the end of November. Monies were spent for the dishwasher and piano moving and tuning.

Building Fund Report:

The balance remains \$5,882.96.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

The new cleaning couple are doing a great job. Jim says we may not need heat tapes on the building because of increased insulating that has been done.

Christian Education Commission:

Our Sunday school kids did a great job making items and helping at the bazaar. Thanks to them and their moms for all their hard work. We continue to help in many ways with the Plymouth Street Ministry program. There will be no "regular" Christmas Pageant this year; our youth will be featured in worship on December 23.

Stewardship Commission:

Met on December 9. Rob and Larry were the only members at the meeting. They discussed the same issues as listed in the Financial Reports: scrip cards, nut sales, and pledges.

Worship Commission:

Poinsettias will be delivered and arranged on the weekend of December 16. Christmas Eve worship is at 5:00 P.M.
