

PASTOR'S PEN

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

When you receive this I will be off on a vacation, but more importantly I will be at a reunion with my beloved, for which reunion I am most thankful. However, this particular reunion means that I will not be able to attend the Huber Family's annual Labor Day Fish Boil family reunion and community jubilee. I look forward to that event every year, and feel diminished when I am not there. I was not able to attend any while I was living in NYC and Hawaii, and have found being at them again to be quite a blessing. A good chance to catch up with cousins and other relatives. For many of us, that is the only time each year we see each other, except the occasional funeral or wedding.

There is always a choice to be made, and an opportunity cost related to it. That is much of what life is about, though, isn't it? As a child, I dreamed of the day when I could make choices myself. Now as an adult, I miss those days when my choices were limited. With maturity comes the need for balancing our own lives. We are in a world filled with marvel and wonder, and surrounded by people we love and love to see, and have opportunities to attend far more than we could ever manage. We can't do everything, so we have to pass up on some things in order to accept others. Sometimes I am absolutely positive I have chosen the right thing, such as choosing to see Yuki instead of choosing to see my extended family. Sometimes it doesn't matter, such as choosing whether to see Wolverine or Despicable Me 2 first. (The answer? Despicable Me 2: it

is, I kid you not, one of the funniest movies I have ever seen. I thought I was going to wreck a lung laughing.) Sometimes I just don't know, such as choosing a college, a life-mate, or a career.

One of the attractions the church has for

me is that it is filled with people asking some of those questions, and filled with wise people who have had to answer them and can offer counsel. Where else but the church, or other religious institution, do people from age 1 to age 100, of all walks of life and experiences and careers, come together to share with one another and have those intimate relationships of helping each other through life. Outside of my family, the greatest help to me since I have been a child has been the church. Specifically, the people in the church. Because as the old children's song says, the church is not a building, it's the people. On Sundays, during quilting, at our socials and bazaars and thrift sales, I see you good people of Plymouth asking each other questions, asking advice, offering counsel, supporting and praying for one another. People who otherwise might have no reason to be together, are together because of your faith. I thank God for that spirit in this congregation, and I think it is a pretty special thing. So special that I think it ought to be shared—so many others are also searching, looking, aching for love and to belong, and to know people who will care for them. EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MINUTES

August 12, 2013

Members present: Barb Kleist, Rob Jaenke, Louise Partlow, Larry Kleist, and Pastor David Huber

Barb called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. The July minutes were read and approved.

Financial Reports:

As of July 31, 2013

Year to Date Income \$63,539.13 Year to Date Expenses \$63,072.22 Ahead (Behind) \$466.91

Treasurer's Report:

Income for July was \$6,168.64 (includes \$900 from Reserve Fund); expenses were \$6,752.44 for a loss of (\$583.80). Bank balance on July 31, 2013 was \$19.95. Envelope giving is down about \$3,600 from last year.

Reserve Fund Report:

The balance is \$323.97.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance is \$2,375.61.

Building Fund Report:

The balance is \$908.75. This account will be closed (per Council) and the balance put into the General Fund.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

Lock on the door in the Fellowship Hall has been repaired.

Christian Education Commission:

The Sunday School room has been redecorated and looks very good.

Stewardship Commission:

SCRIP program doing well. A check for \$600 has been deposited into the General Fund. A Thrift and Bake Sale will be held on Saturday, September 14. Please be sure to bring your priced items whenever you have them ready. Our General Fund needs help. Larry and Barb will compose a letter for members to explain more on this.

Worship Commission:

Outdoor worship on August 14 with music and s'mores. A fall clean-up on the first weekend in October is planned. More info to come on this.

Service Commission:

Visits are ongoing. If you visit any of our shut-ins, be sure to fill out a visitation card and drop it in the envelope provided on the table outside the sanctuary so that we can make sure no one "falls through the cracks."

Women of Plymouth:

Women are working on the Fall Bazaar. Remember Saturday, November 23. Please be thinking of craft ideas and treasures for the bazaar.

PASTOR'S REPORT:
