The stewardship emphasis is now complete. The final results of the appeal for 2014 are as follows: 19 households of Plymouth United Church of Christ have committed a total of \$49,757 (last year at this time we had 22 giving units pledge \$53,570) for the coming year.



So, for example, if you buy a \$100 card, we pay \$95 and keep \$5 to help pay our bills. This is a great way to add to our income without feeling the pinch.

Dear Friends and Family of Plymouth,

Another year ends and a new one comes upon us, wiped clean of all past mistakes, a fresh slate ripe with opportunity in our personal lives, our family lives, and our church life. I offer you a prayer that whatever resolutions you might make for 2014, the Holy Spirit will strengthen you to keep them. I pray that your hopes will be fulfilled by God. Do not forget the real power of prayer. Pray for wisdom and faithful stewardship. EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MINUTES

Barb called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Pastor David led us in prayer. The November minutes were read and approved.

Financial Reports:

As of November 30, 2013 Year to Date Income \$97,642.71 Year to Date Expenses \$97,268.62 Ahead (Behind) \$374.09

Treasurer's Report:

Income for November was \$7,374.03; expenses were \$7,527.96 for a loss of (\$153.93). Bank balance on November 30, 2013 was (\$72.87). Income includes \$1,400 from the Reserve Fund. Income was down about \$2,500 from last year.

Reserve Fund Report:

The balance is \$451.00.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance is \$7,376.15.

Street Ministry:

The balance is \$280.27

Council will check with PIP board members and Stewardship Commission to change the PIP guidelines regarding distribution of donations that are not regular weekly giving. The Council approved 75% to PIP and 25% to General Fund (instead of 15% to General Fund and 10% to Missions).

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

Snow plowing got done. Jim or Larry will make sure we have this taken care of.

Christian Education Commission:

The Confirmation class made items for the bazaar and worked hard at the event. We held an "intergenerational Sunday School" class on December 8. We invited the Confirmation class, the Adult Ed. group, and anyone who wanted to attend to have some Christmas goodies, share stories and memories, and make some ornaments. Lots of fun. Adult Ed. continues discussing "Women in the Bible." All are welcome to join in any week. They meet in the library at 9:15 A.M.



Nut sales were approximately \$1,000. Actual numbers not available yet. Pledges now are about \$47,500, about \$9,000 less than last year at this time. Not all pledges are in.

Worship Commission:

We decorated for Advent last Saturday and had a great lunch and was fun as usual. Christmas pot luck and cookie exchange will be December 15.
