Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

We just completed another successful thrift and bake sale. Not just successful, but really successful! Record-breaking successful! As I sit here writing, I am impressed that we brought in over \$1700 from the thrift sale and over \$300 from the bake sale. But what really impresses me is YOU. All of you who made the sale happen. The many hours spent setting up tables and pricing items and organizing our goods. We had our clothes sorted by sizes this time! That's a lot of work. Hours spent baking. And hours spent working the thrift sale, helping customers, showing hospitality, carrying items to cars. Some of you helped to make sure the lawn and gardens were in top notch condition to be attractive as people drove in. And of course, your generosity in donating so many good items. All of you had a choice that you could have held your own thrift sale, but instead you offered your gifts to your church, and that fills me with thanksgiving. We do important work here at Plymouth church in our ministry to the community. Working together, like in our thrift sales or our donations to St. Francis or our quilters who help to keep homeless families warm with handmade quilts, we are making a difference in Eau Claire and beyond.

We had a wonderful write up in the Leader Telegram about our street ministry, featuring Mike Henry, that has helped to draw attention to the needs of the homeless as well as draw attention to us. You can see the article on the LT's website (search "Eau Claire ministry

takes to the streets to help those in need"). Or pick up a copy at church. We printed up a bunch of them. Take one for yourself, and take more to share with others so you can show them what we are doing here as you invite them to join us.

We are making a positive difference in people's lives in Eau Claire. The article shows that, and I hope our own lives reflect that.

As we have been having more people visiting us for worship and becoming involved in our congregation, the two things I hear most from them about why they came and why they returned is that we are doing something in the community (street ministry, quilters, Community Table, St. Francis Food Pantry), and because we are so welcoming and filled with hospitality. A recent Barna study shows that most people make up their mind about a church within the first 8 minutes: that includes our well-kept lawns and gardens, our clean building and sanctuary, the friendly greetings at the door that you offer, your hospitality in the sanctuary and fellowship time, and the opening music of worship.

So I thank you all for your generosity of time, talents, and treasures. And thank you for your hospitality. The Holy Spirit is moving and working in wonderful ways in this congregation by working through YOU as we live out Jesus' words about loving our neighbors.

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income for August was \$9,592.35. Total expenses for the month were \$10,277.83, leaving us with an August loss of (\$685.48). Funds were transferred from PIP (\$3,650.00). Income was close to last year—four-year average down (\$4.038).

Reserve Fund Balance: \$322.37.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$15,827.92.

Street Ministry Balance: \$60.20.

Last winter was a brutally cold and we at the street ministry do not want to get caught off guard this year. People on the street get nervous around this time of year because of the weather fluctuations. They know winter is near.

Please, if you would starting looking around for winter things now. We will start taking clothes in this coming Wednesday. We are not storing clothes at Plymouth this year because of space considerations and have a neighboring church graciously allowing us to keep our materials at there site. But feel free to bring things to Plymouth Church at 2010 Moholt Dr. and we will transport them to our other location. And if you contact us we will also come by and pick them up from you.

Right now we can use sweat pants and sweat shirts and sweat shirts with hoods of all sizes. People wear layers and so large and all the extra large sizes up to 5X would be appreciated. One size fits all gloves, scarfs and stocking caps. Fall jackets and long underwear.

We can use T-shirts especially the large sizes and white socks for men and women. Men's and women's underwear. Boxers and regular style for men.
