# Don't forget your SCRIP cards!

SCRIP cards are now available for Mega, Gordy's, and Kwik Trip. It is a painless, cost-free fundraiser for our church. Here is how it works: They are available for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. We a keep 5% of the money that is paid for Mega and Gordy's cards, and 10% for Mega Holiday and Kwik Trip cards. So, for example, if you buy a \$100 card, we pay \$95 and keep \$5 to help pay our bills. This is a great way to add to our income without feeling the pinch.

Beginning January 1, 2015, Kwik Trip will reduce the percentage of our discount to 5% for gas. However, we will receive an additional 10% rebate for anything purchased in-store with the exception of cigarettes, gift cards, lottery/lotto, and stamps. That means merchandise purchased in-store will net us 15% discount!

December 8, 2014

Deb called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. The November Council minutes were reviewed and approved.

#### **Financial Reports:**

As of November 30, 2014
Year to Date Income \$109,732.81
Year to Date Expenses \$108,114.45
Ahead (Behind) \$1,618.36

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Income for November was \$6,714.29. Total expenses for the month were \$6,475.46, leaving us with a November gain of \$238.83. Funds were transferred from other accounts and the Reserve Fund. Expenses were normal for November. One snow plowing bill just received for five plowings.

### **Reserve Fund Report:**

The balance is \$\$373.40.

#### **Memorial Fund Report:**

The balance is \$9,074.38.

#### **Street Ministry:**

The balance is \$12.19

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Building and Grounds:**

No report. Having vacuum problems. WOP will make a decision on repair or purchase or both.

#### **Christian Education Commission:**

No report.

#### **Stewardship Commission:**

They are in the middle of the 2015 campaign. Letters will be sent out soon. Nut profits of about \$1,500 will be received soon.

Council recommended we continue to have \$20,000 available for General Fund from PIP. We won't need that much hopefully. We just need to be prepared in case. Motion was passed.

Pot luck this Sunday, December 14. December 21 we will have a regular service in the morning and a Blue Christmas service at 6:00 P.M. Christmas Eve service is at 5:00 P.M. as usual.
