Pastor's Pen

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Summer is here! Four of our youth and I started our summer with a wonderful week at the Music Art Dance and Drama Camp (MADD) at Moon Beach, one of our two magnificent camp/retreat sites that we own through the Wisconsin Conference. The ministry that is done year-round at these two beautiful sanctuaries is a tremendous part of the overall ministry that we do in this Conference, for children and for adults! They aren't just summer camps for kids, but year-round retreat centers for adults, and also for families, church groups, and even outside groups, like our amazing camps for kids with autism.

I'd like to say that we are lucky to have two sites that are so excellent (and we are), but the reason we have them is because of the vision and hard work of a great many people who made them happen and who have taken care of them over the years. Not just luck, but focused dedication to ensuring we have beautiful outdoor ministry sites for our people.

When I think of what I enjoy most about the week of MADD camp that I get to experience each year, many things come to mind. The amazing talents of our young people is always a joy. We have a lot of talented youth in our churches. The food is great, the scenery gorgeous. But the highlight for me is the way that our camps create miniature realms of God. The community formed during the week is one based on love, mutual acceptance of each others' oddities, and a joy of

being together. I see older youth helping out the younger ones with canoes, platters of food, and teaching them how to sail or weave a basket. I see the youth listen intently while one of the campers with Downs Syndrome responds to a question, offers a prayer, or tells a story. One of our campers, an African American boy who has been coming for eight years, said that what he likes best about camp is that it is the one week of the year that no one makes fun of his skin color or calls him names.

Whether it be a week of children or family camp or one of the many varieties of weekend retreats, camp is a place to practice living out the realm of God: a community of love, respect, dignity, and mutual care. They are incubators for us who follow Jesus to learn better how to live into God's vision of how the world ought to be. Thank God for both of our campsites, and for the hundreds of people who make them what they are.
