## Pastor's Pen

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,



We have had a blessed summer this year. The weather has been mostly beautiful. We had a wonderful outing to an Eau Claire Express Game in July. We had a fun evening of songs and s'mores just a few days ago, though it was on that cold rainy Wednesday so we ended up inside, making s'mores with high tech means instead of a campfire... special guest musician Steve Carlson shared his song "Lotto Jesus" for us, and we talked about the Beatitudes, and sang an awful lot of songs. We also had a number of visitors and guests over the summer, joining us for worship, coming for the recital that Sam and Hannah Zehms offered, or coming to Plymouth's campus for a number of events that other groups held here.

I mentioned in the last Pastor's Pen that we have divided the coming year into three sections called Connect, Grow, and Love. We are in the connect period, and will be until October. I have been preaching about connecting: with your neighbors, with people in the community, and with people in the church. Connecting and invitation go together. We connect with people to invite them, and we invite people in order to connect them with our fellowship. I've been talking a lot this year about the importance of inviting. That cannot be stressed enough. Current research shows that about 80% of people who join a church have done so because someone invited them (and many of them also because the inviting person physically brought them to the church). The first experience with a church might not even be worship: it might have been something like a baseball game, an evening around a campfire, a party, a concert, a potluck. Or it might have been what I mentioned before,

an "elbow activity" —a small group gathering of church people who each invited a friend to come with them to see a movie, have lunch, play cards, go to the park for a concert, take a hike, and so on. These elbow activities are great ways to introduce people to the church in an informal way that allows for conversation and relationship building—that is, connecting!

I'm challenging you all here, and in Sunday sermons, as part of your faith growth, to connect with some people around you. Take someone to lunch, and invite a couple church members with you and have them bring someone. That's how we enlarge our footprint in the community and spread Jesus' light to those around us! When you do this, let me know, or let anyone on our church growth team know, so that we know what people are doing and to say "thank you!"

Lastly, I am on vacation September 7 through 30. Rev. Mark Pirazzini from First Congregational will be covering in case of pastoral emergencies. You can always call the church office and either Mimi or the answering machine will have information on how to contact him. Since it seems impossible for a pastor to go on vacation and not work, I'll be preaching at Amagasaki UCCJ while I am there, and attending the Japanese Hymn Society's annual meeting, which is always fun and educational.

#### Service Committee:


Visits are ongoing by Pastor David and other church members. Please remember to fill out a visitation card—even for phone visits. Sending cards would be appreciated also.

## Don't forget your SCRIP cards!

SCRIP cards are now available for Mega, Mega Holiday, Gordy's, and Kwik Trip. It is a painless, cost-free fund raiser for our church. Here is how it works: They are available for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. We keep 5% of the money that is paid for Mega, Gordy's, and Kwik Trip cards, and 10% for Mega Holiday cards. And at Kwik Trip, when the card is used *inside* the store (with some restrictions like tobacco, alcohol, stamps) they will deposit a 10% rebate into our bank account. So, for example, if you buy a \$100 Mega card, we pay \$95 and keep \$5 to help pay our bills. This is a great way to add to our income without feeling the pinch.
