

Pastor's Pen

Dear family and friends of Plymouth,

September has come and darn near gone. I started mine with an overnight down in Janesville to see my niece's new daughter, who was born in July, and whom I hadn't met yet. Her presence now makes my sister a grandmother, and wow, does that feel weird to say! Then a few days later an overnight trip to the family farm outside Melrose over Labor Day Weekend. I spent the night with an aunt, and she cooked a splendid fried chicken dinner with all the fixin's, and then we had our annual Huber family reunion/Fish boil that Saturday. I've missed that reunion the past three or four years because of my trips to Japan, so it was good to be with family again and see some cousins I've not seen in a long time. And also to hear the news that the baby of my father's family, the youngest of his siblings, will turn 70 this year. That, too, is shocking to say! Then I came back to Plymouth for worship on Sunday, and that evening I was on the airport shuttle to Minneapolis for another reunion: with my family in Japan. I'm still in the midst of that reunion as I write this. It will be October before I see any of you again. The time does fly by quickly, and so all the more reason to be sure to spend time with the family and friends that we hold dear to our hearts.

Part of my spiritual practice and discipleship this year has been to make sure to set aside time on my calendar, and keep those times as sacred, to spend time with the people who matter the most in my life. It's so easy to get caught up in the frenzy of busy-ness and let other people control your time and then realize you've gone months or longer without giving your time to those who deserve it the most. So far it has been a good discipline for me. It has forced me to rethink priorities, and also helped me remember just how much I truly do value the people I've spent extra time with. Especially as we are all getting older. Almost half of my parents' brothers and sisters have died, and so I try to cherish more each moment I have with those

who remain, and have been working more diligently to carve out time to spend with them.

What spurred this for me was a twofold confluence of realizing I short-changed too much the people I love by not being available for them, and the ever growing sense that as followers of Jesus—as God's people—it's all about relationship. We are meant to be together. This is why we worship in groups and form churches, and don't simply go out and worship alone, or practice our faith alone, or even keep our faith to ourselves. We are meant to share these experiences with others. God calls us to community. As I finish this vacation time with my Japanese friends and family, I am meditating on the importance of keeping up those ties that bind us together and keep us rooted. Otherwise it is much too easy to float off into the wind because we have nothing holding us down, and we are too busy being everything for everyone and forgetting to also be someone for ourselves.

My your various communities of family, friends, and especially your church, be a place of grounding and nurture for you. And if you've not been with your church in a while, I think the Spirit may be calling you to carve out some time to spend with God by carving out time to spend with your brothers and sisters in Christ.
