Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

We're in an important holiday season, so I won't say much, just highlight some of the great things coming up at Plymouth this month.

Perhaps the most significant day, next to Christmas Eve, is that on Sunday, Dec. 6, we welcome three new members, Pat, Meghan, and Donald, into our church family! It's also our pledge Sunday with Communion, and a celebration potluck lunch after worship. Spend time with your church family, welcome its newest members, and offer your support for the coming year.

The day before, on Saturday, Dec. 5 is our annual Christmas decorating day. Always a fun time of fellowship and making our church building beautiful for the Advent and Christmas seasons. We'll be serving lunch, too! This is from 10 A.M. to 1 P.M. or whenever we finish.

Dec. 20 is our second annual Blue Christmas worship service at 6:00 P.M. Blue Christmas is a tradition that began a few years ago and is gaining popularity. The worship service is for those who feel down, depressed, lonely, or otherwise blue at Christmas. With the social and media pressure to be joyous at Christmas, plus images of happy families and perfect lives, and it sets an unrealistic expectation. This worship is a prayerful affirmation of these feelings.

Dec. 24 is our Christmas Eve service of Lessons and Carols at 5 P.M., with our wonderful readers offering the Christmas story of Jesus' birth, and lots of special music from our church musicians. I find this service makes me really feel like Christmas has come. It's also a perfect worship service to invite people to hear the message of hope and love that is the Christmas story. Bring someone with you and share our message with others.

# **Treasurer's Report:**

Income for October was \$7,365.76. Total expenses for the month were \$7,482.42, leaving us with an October loss of \$116.66. Envelope income was down \$5,953 from last year and down \$6,275 from previous 6 years average. Monies needed to be transferred from Memorial and PIP Reserve funds to cover our bill payments. We need to catch up on Food Pantry, OCWM, and OGHS.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$391.50. Memorial Fund Balance: \$4,419.90. Street Ministry Balance: \$2,148.81.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.
