Pastor's Pen

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,



Our theme this year during Lent is "choices." Our Gospel lessons on these Sundays are stories of people making choices, from which we may learn about our own choices and how we react to those made by others. Ultimately, of course, we want to make choices (as individuals and as a church) that are healthy, loving, and faithful. Especially faithful. Though if we are making our choices in a faithful way, the other aspects will take care of themselves!

One of the choices every church is faced with is whether and how to let their community know they exist, or to keep quiet what they are doing on Sunday mornings. I'm on the side of believing that announcing our presence is the faithful thing to do. In the past few years, Plymouth has been working to be more visible in our community. Our most recent act was opening our doors to the Westridge Neighborhood Association to meet in our building, and to offer ourselves for the benefit of our neighborhood. Two wonderful Plymouth members provided hospitality, and around twenty people attended. We learned that a few people did not know there was a church in their neighborhood (even with us being a polling place!). Opening our doors to our neighborhood—so that we can be good neighbors—is a good choice, and I am thankful that we have done so.

We have made that choice as a church. But we as individuals also can make that choice to let people know about our church. We, too, have the choice of

inviting people to our worship and fellowship. I am again on the side of believing that telling people we are here and inviting them to Plymouth is a very good thing. This month offers a great opportunity to extend an invitation: Easter morning! Easter is a day that a lot of people go to church. People who don't normally go to worship, people who haven't gone in a long time, and people curious about what this "Easter thing" is all about. Wouldn't it be great if they chose to join us at Plymouth because you invited them? With our Magnificent Muffin Morning breakfast before worship, it should be an easy invitation to say "yes" to! Invite your friends, co-workers, neighbors to breakfast and to experience the good news of Easter morning, that God loves us all!

As we consider our faith journeys this Lent, and in particular how and why we make choices, let us all choose to open our hands in invitation to worship with us on Easter morning, or any other Sunday (or our Lent Wednesday soup lunches and suppers!). Easter's empty tomb and its promise of new life is God's invitation to humanity to join in this new life and new relationship with our loving God. Let us choose this Easter to extend God's invitation to those around us!

Income for January was \$8,227.37. Total expenses for the month were \$8,253.53, leaving us with a January loss of \$26.16. Envelope income and expenses were normal for the month.

Reserve Fund Report:

January balance is \$919.82.

Street Ministry Report:

January balance is \$1,964.54.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

One furnace needed another service call. We will have them checked every year as the repair person suggested. Leadership Team will check with Jim Welk for his thoughts.

Christian Education Commission:

No report, but they are starting to plan for Easter morning.

Stewardship Commission:

They will be working to prepare for the May thrift sale. Everyone collect and prepare your merchandise.

Service Commission:

Visits are ongoing by Pastor David and other church members. Please remember to fill out a visitation card—even for phone visits. Sending cards would be appreciated also.

Worship Commission:

Lent has started with Ash Wednesday with Soup and Scripture at noon and 6:00 P.M. on Wednesdays. Empty Bowls tickets are available from Barb Kleist and Mimi in our office. We will serve the Community Table on March 19.

Northwest Association Annual Meeting April 9, 2016

The 54th Annual Meeting of the Association will be held at First Congregational UCC in La Crosse on Saturday, April 9. The Rev. Anita Bradshaw, PhD, author of Change and Conflict in Your Congregation (Even if You Hate Both), will be the keynote speaker. Conference Minister Rev. Franz Rigert will be there to encourage our participation in "Shift: From Maintenance to Mission" which explores fresh paradigms for ministry in the 21st century. The closing worship will include the Service of Installation for Rev. Bob MacDougal as Associate Conference Minister. If you are interested in attending, please speak with Pastor David.

Don't forget your SCRIP cards!

SCRIP cards are now available for Mega Holiday, Gordy's, Festival, and Kwik Trip. It is a painless, cost-free fundraiser for our church. Here is how it works: They are available for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. We keep 3% of what is paid for Festival, 5% Gordy's, and Kwik Trip cards, and 10% for Mega Holiday cards. And at Kwik Trip, when the card is used inside the store (with some restrictions like tobacco, alcohol, stamps) they will deposit a 10% rebate into our bank account. So, for example, if you buy a \$100 Gordy's card, we pay \$95 and keep \$5 to help pay our bills. In 2015, we earned over \$1,500! This is a great way to add to our income without feeling the pinch.
