
28th Annual Senior Americans Day

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Good things are happening at Plymouth! We have accepted an invitation to host a choir being formed for people affected by dementia, with Cathy Reitz directing. Cathy and I went to Minneapolis recently to spend a day with their dementia choir which was started in 2014. Their level of engagement with the music was uplifting, the 40 or so people singing with joy and gusto songs like "Sing," "I Want to Hold Your Hand," and "O Susannah." They also have fellowship and snack time before and after rehearsals to ensure that their time together is building a community. Dementia is an isolating disease, and this choir is one way to help make it less lonely for both sufferers and caretakers. Our choir begins in August, with a concert at Plymouth in November, then more in the winter and spring at other venues. I am excited that Plymouth is able to host and provide this ministry of community. Some of our members have suffered from dementia. This is a good way

to honor them while we follow Jesus' example of love and compassion to our neighbors. I'll write more about volunteer opportunities once we know our needs. If you'd like to help, please send me a note!

On another topic, I recently finished a six-week program at The Center (in Altoona) called "The Rest that Works: Living a Life of Loving Mindfulness," a spiritual journey of centering oneself more deeply into God's love. It was led by Rev. Scott Daniels, who owns The Center with his wife. Our group of eight had deep and personal conversations about faith, life, and God. I found it helped me move more toward a center rooted in God's love by finding permission to take time out to meditate, pray, or otherwise be at rest and mindful. That is why it is called "The rest that works"—sometimes the most productive thing we can do is to stop producing and be at rest with God. We will offer it at Plymouth later this summer. The July newsletter will have more information. You can buy his book at The Center or from Amazon. I highly recommend you deepen your faith by being part of this group.

Lastly, I always like to ask that as you travel, please bring back bulletins from any churches where you worship. I enjoy seeing how other congregations are serving their communities and how they worship.

Financial Reports:

As of April 30, 2016

Year to Date Income \$35,862.02

Year to Date Expenses \$36,093.42

Ahead (Behind) \$231.40

Treasurer's Report:

Income for April was \$7,091.81. This includes \$1,800.00 from Reserve Fund. Total expenses for the month were \$7,465.47, leaving us with an April loss of \$373.66. Envelope income was average for April in past years.

Reserve Fund Report:

The balance is \$493.70.

Memorial Fund Report:

The balance is \$904.83.

Street Ministry Report:

The balance is \$1,938.46.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

It was suggested that we check on prices to re-surface and stripe the parking lot. No plans to do this yet. Jim Welk and Rex Olson have been removing some downed trees and cleaning up our woods. June 4 is our clean-up day. A lot of help is needed.

Be a sponsor!

Don't forget your SCRIP cards!

SCRIP cards are now available for Mega Holiday, Gordy's, Festival, and Kwik Trip. It is a painless, cost-free fundraiser for our church. Here is how it works: They are available for \$25, \$50, and/or \$100. We keep 3% of what is paid for Festival, 5% Gordy's, and Kwik Trip cards, and 10% for Mega Holiday cards. And at Kwik Trip, when the card is used *inside* the store (with some restrictions like tobacco, alcohol, stamps) they will deposit a 10% rebate into our bank account. So, for example, if you buy a \$100 Gordy's card, we pay \$95 and keep \$5 to help pay our bills. In 2015, we earned over \$1,500! This is a great way to add to our income without feeling the pinch.
