Minutes of the July meeting were reviewed and approved with one correction. The Treasurer's Report stated we were down \$750 from last year. That was for June only! Year to date, we are down approximately \$7,500.

Treasurer's Report:

Income for July was \$5,554.53; expenses for July were \$6,085.51. We had a loss for July of (\$530.98). July income was down from last year \$1,427.00. Some monies were received from insurance that will cover lost income from this year and for replacement for some of Mimi and Pastor David's items lost in the fire. Breakdown will be figured out. With some of these monies we will be able to catch up on OCWM, Food Pantry, and pay 3rd quarter pensions, etc.

Bank balance end of July: (\$401.21) **Reserve Fund Balance:** \$1,036.00 **Memorial Fund Balance:** \$9,125.03

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Building and Grounds:

Lawn is being mowed. Some large weeds need to be taken care of, maybe some Round-Up.

Stewardship:

The Nut Sale will be here before too long. Regarding Scrip cards, there will be some changes in store policies and we're working on new plans.

Worship:

Outdoor Worship will take place at our church location on August 23. There will be s'mores and songs.

Service:

Keep calling and visiting members and let Mimi know if you have contacted someone. Thank you.

Pastor's Report:

Community Table serving went well. We will have a baptism on September 10 for new baby Grace Rose Cartmill. Aurora Robison's baby girl may be baptized later this fall. The next Interfaith Prayer Service will be October 4 at Grace Lutheran at 7:00 P.M. Clergy Retreat will be October 1–3. Pastor David will be on vacation October 5–11.
