thoughts are toward the outdoors. Being able to open the windows and get some fresh air into my home has been wonderful. Hearing all the new bird songs as birds return and spend more time at my feeders. Watching the buds on the trees that are just popping out. Spring is a beautiful time of new life and new possibilities.

With May being right on top of us, that also means we're another

month closer to our new building! The move-in time is still planned for August, so only three months away. That's a lot closer than the expected ten months when we broke ground at the end of October, or the eighteen months we were looking at when we first met with the architects at the end of 2016. As of the end of April, all the exterior work is finished, all the outside windows and doors are in, some of the rooms have been painted, some ceiling tiles are in place, and thermostats have been installed. In the past month, we've chosen a lot of furniture for the offices, fellowship room, sanctuary, and gathering place, and we ordered-and have already received—our industrial coffee maker! I joked on Easter morning that the only two inside items we had

ordered as of that point were the two essential components a church needs: chairs for the sanctuary and the coffee maker. Even if we had nothing else, we'd be well set for Sunday morning! But of course, we will have more, and what your leadership team and you have been choosing is beautiful, well-made, functional, and will make our new home truly special.

Every time I'm at the building site, I get more excited for what is to come! Each week's work makes it more real and gives a better sense of what the whole will look like. After the Northwest Association Annual Meeting here in Eau Claire on April 21, I gave a tour to some of our fellow UCCers from around the Northwest and they all thought it wonderful, a good floor plan, and well made.

Also at the Annual Meeting I expressed our gratitude to our sister churches for their support of prayer, donations, and letters since the fire.

Coming this month, we celebrate Pentecost on May 20, so remember to wear red that day! Red is the traditional color in the church for days of celebration, like ordinations, installations, gatherings (like the Association annual meeting), and Pentecost—red symbolizes the Holy Spirit's tongues of flame that came upon the disciples on Pentecost Day after Jesus' resurrection.

Income for March was \$6,542.60. Expenses for March were \$8,460.07. Envelope giving for the year was up a little from last year, but down from the last 8 year average. We have the quarterly payments coming up and need to come up with the money to cover them. Scrip profits and some general fund money will help. We are supposed to get a check from the insurance company for loss of income, which would help us out tremendously.
