We had an exciting day on August 11 as we welcomed three new members to our congregation: Ben Bechle, Cathy Lawler, and Ken Snart! So good to add you all to our church family!

Your church was also out serving our



neighbors on August 3 at the Community Table where we served about 100 people. Many thanks to our Plymouth cooks and cleaners who made that happen! For many of the people that Community Table serves, that is their only meal for the day or is the only time they get to be with other people during the day. The Community Table provides food for the hungry, but the "Community" part of the name is just as important for those who live alone or aren't able to get out as much as they might

like. So thank you also to all of you who give to our monthly offering for Community Table.

Our quilters, with the help of the experts from Bed, Bath, and Drapery installed the veterans quilt we received from DeLong Middle School. It now hangs in the Fellowship Room and looks great! Our quilters also made some privacy coverings for the windows in the doors of the classroom— now if a bridal party is using the room to get dressed, or other group is using the space and needs privacy, we can cover the windows with beautiful fabrics.

There are many things that get done in the church that go unnoticed and uncelebrated: those of you who volunteered to clean the building in the weeks we didn't have a hired cleaning person; lawn mowers and trimmers; those who come by to water the lawn and the plants; the caretakers of our inside plants; the window washers; the weed removers; the sign painters; those who set the tables for pot lucks and clean up afterward; our communion preparers and clean up crew; our Leadership Team who put in a lot of time and effort to keep the finances straight and the bills paid, who make decisions on behalf of the congregation, and who make sure our life together runs as smoothly as possible; and I'm sure I'm missing many things. Our Moderator, Barb Kleist called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Minutes of the June meeting were reviewed and accepted. (There was no meeting in July.)

Financial Reports:

Treasurer's Report:

Income for July was \$14,651.09. Income included approximately \$10,000 envelope giving. Expenses were \$12,521.77. Income through July was up; also was up last year.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$57.59 (*This account will be closed*)

Memorial Fund Balance: \$8,192.02

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

Stewardship will meet next Sunday afternoon, August 11, 2019. Thrift Sale will be September 21.

Worship:

Three new members will be joining our church on August 11. They are Ben Bechle, Ken Snart, and Cathy Lawler. Outdoor worship will be Wednesday, August 23 with music and s'mores.

Women of Plymouth:

The Fall Bazaar will be November 16.

Building and Grounds:

Lawn repair and landscaping around signs. Green Oasis will repair grass and replace some plants. Window washing is almost done. Inside is finished. Thank Mimi for all of her work. Also, we have a new cleaning person. She started last week.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David is attending a Stewardship Boot Camp Seminar/Education Event August 11. Tuesday he is also attending the Conference dedication of their new solar array.

Old Business:

- Insurance: We will hopefully be receiving some funds to close out some remaining fire related issues.
 \$10,000 approximately; also \$41,000 for Pastor David's and Mimi's personal items that needed to be replaced and \$4,000 to replace fencing.
