So good to see the congregation come together to make something happen for our neighbors and for ourselves. I heard a lot of laughter and saw many smiles from satisfied

customers happy with their purchases and with their lunches.

We'll gather again to decorate our building for Advent and Christmas on Saturday, Dec. 7 at 10 am. We'll put up the trees and wreaths and nativity scenes and other decorations, and then have some lunch of soup and other goodies. We're usually finished in a few hours.

Our Advent worship this season will revolve

around the Christmas Carol "Joy to the World." Last year we celebrated the 200th anniversary of Silent Night, and this year it's the 300th anniversary of Isaac Watts' interpretation of Psalm 98. Rather than joy being a synonym for happiness, I think of joy as deeper (and less liminal) than happiness. Happiness is for specific moments in which life is going well for us; joy is a kind of hope, a feeling of contentment, a sense of peacefulness, that can bring us through the dark times when we are not at all happy. To invite Jesus into the inns of

our hearts is to invite a holy joy into our lives that can sustain us in grief, and can fill us with exuberance in the times of wonder and awe. We will discover that the depths of joy can be found especially in the midst of suffering, the work of justice, and the presence of compassion—all part of the coming of Jesus to this world and a message the world so desperately needs.

We finish Advent with our beautiful Christmas Eve worship service of lessons and carols, singing Silent Night by candelight, to welcome Emmanuel, God incarnate, into our world and into our lives.

May you find room this Advent for some quiet time in the midst of the busyness, and find room in your hearts for the holy to dwell in you with joy, and hope, peace, and love as well.

Our Moderator, Barb Kleist called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Minutes of the October meeting were reviewed and accepted.

Financial Reports:

As of Octoberber 31, 2019 Year to Date Income \$100,730.87 Year to Date Expenses \$100,596.44 Ahead (Behind) \$134.43

Treasurer's Report:

Income for October was \$5,908.58. Expenses were \$7,507.65. Envelope giving for the month was up approximately \$800 from 2018. Scrip card income for October was \$900.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$6,901.56 **Reserve Fund Balance:** \$4,063.41

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

Mixed nuts have arrived and will be at the Bazaar. Stewardship Sunday will be December 15 with a pot luck. We will collect pledge cards on that day.

Worship:

Decorating the church for Christmas will be on December 7 at 10:00 A.M. Lunch will be provided. Everyone is welcome to come and help.

Women of Plymouth:

All focus has been on the November 16 Annual Holiday Bazaar.

Building and Grounds:

Snow removal will be done by the same person we have had.

Pastor's Report:

Pastor David will submit information on the Bazaar to the Leader-Telegram Religion Page and post it on Facebook. He will be having oral surgery early in December and will be out December 4–7



Old Business:

- All insurance monies from the fire have been received. \$18,500 is in our Fire Account. We still have some things to take care of. Linda Oliver moved to put Fire Account monies into the Reserve Fund and close the Fire Account so we can access it for expenses with the building as they come up. Larry Kleist seconded. Motioned passed.
- Building Use Policy is still in progress. The Leadership Team is still working on this.
- Baby Shower: May change to Diaper Shower in February—more information later. This is to help new mothers on assistance.
