Virtual Holiday Bake Sale

Well, it's not really, but kind of. We would like to have a Bake Sale for the holidays. It would be advertised on Facebook and by your letting friends and relatives know. We would take orders on Facebook or by calling the church office. It would not be for just anything, but for specific items. We would like each baker to decide what they want to make and how much of that item



they are willing to make. Prior to November 1, the bakers (our members) will be contacted by Joanne Miller to see what you would like to bake. It doesn't have to be a lot, one or two things would be great. Then we'll list items on our Facebook page along with how many items will be available and the price. For instance if someone said they would bake five loaves of white bread, we would list that and not sell any more than that. We will ask for orders from customers from November 1 to November 10. After that time, the bakers will be contacted and told how much they need to bake. It could very well be less than what was offered.

Baking must be done under sanitary conditions with gloves and masks worn while preparing and handling. All items should be bagged or plated as the customer wants. We don't want to handle them twice. If needed, we will provide you with masks and gloves.

Drop off for the baked goods will be Thursday, November 19 from 9–4. The customers will pick up November 20, 21, & 22. When the customers order, they will be given a pick up time so we don't have everyone coming at once.

Leadership Team Minutes

September 14, 2020

Members present: Larry Kleist, Barb Kleist, Rob Jaenke, Linda Oliver, Lil Savage, Mimi Pederson, Cindy Halfen, and Pastor David. Ben Bechle joined via Zoom.

Our Moderator, Barb Kleist called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Minutes of the August meeting were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

As of August 31, 2020 Year to Date Income \$91,042.80 Year to Date Expenses \$82,217.87 Ahead (Behind) \$8,894.41

Treasurer's Report:

Income for August was \$19,836.26. (Two gifts of stock were received in August.) Expenses were \$10,901.63. All expenses were paid and up to date, including OCWM and Community Table.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$8,541.00

Memorial Fund Balance: \$7,330.58 Monies from the A/V System line were used to pay for wiring the building for internet and video capability.

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

There was some discussion of doing a virtual Bake Sale since there will be no Thrift Sale or Bazaar this year. Barb will speak to Joanne Miller about how this might be done and report back to the Leadership Team. The Stewardship Campaign for 2020 will be conducted in October with dedication of pledges the second Sunday in November.

Worship:

In person and live streaming going well.

Building and Grounds:

Cindy Halfen brought up planting near the retaining wall behind the building. She wants to remove invasive plants and put in things that attract pollinators. We may be able to get a Creation Care grant from the NW Association to help with the cost.

Pastor's Report:

We received a "care" package from the NW Association that included a "flat" Jesus, some prayers, and a box of disposable face coverings. These things are possible because of our per capita dues paid to the Association. Eau Claire is looking at a new ordinance regarding Covid 19, but we are not sure the exact wording of it and do not know if or how it could impact in-person worship. Further study is ongoing. Online Vespers will resume September 15.

Old Business:

- The Tuesday Morning Book Group is taking all necessary precautions at this time.
- Barb reminded everyone to stay in touch

• Barb shared an estimate from Sound Installations to upgrade the Wifi in the building. It includes four access points, but Pastor David thinks we need only two, one for the sanctuary and one for the fellowship room. It was decided to move ahead with this using funds from the A/V System line and the Fire Donations line in the Memorial Fund.

New Business:

- We are looking at resuming coffee time on Sunday mornings. We think it can be done if we use biodegradable, disposable cups and store-bought, individually wrapped treats. We would need to sit in the fellowship room to be sure to maintain physical distance since eating and drinking cannot be done without removing masks.
- We are also looking into having Communion. Barb will order "kits" that contain wine or grape juice and a wafer in a single serve, pre-packaged container. Communion would be done at the very end of the worship service.

Meeting adjourned at 7:50. Our next meeting will be October 5 at church.

Good News Good News

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

October 4 is World Communion Sunday, when we who are the church, in our many tens of thousands of varying traditions, remember our common sacramental heritage by celebrating Communion together. We will be celebrating Communion this Sunday as well. We are still in the midst of a pandemic, so we continue to need to be careful. To that end, your Leadership Team has been studying best practices for sharing Communion as safely as possible. We'll be using travel communion cups. They are a small plastic cup of juice (about the size of a creamer that you'd have on your table at a diner), sealed tight. A communion wafer is placed on top of the cup, and then both are sealed in plastic. They were designed to easily offer communion to people in hospital, nursing homes, in street/homeless ministries. They are convenient and sterile, and so helpful for sharing communion with people with compromised immune systems or who otherwise need a sterile, safe way of sharing while reducing germ transfer as much as possible. Like so much of 2020, this way of being church will be different, but it will be no less sacramental. I will be very glad to share in the Lord's Supper with you again!

Starting September 30, those of you who join our worship on-line may come to the office and get cups to use at home; or you may also use your own bread and juice (or wine).

Speaking of on-line, we have been having great success with our live streaming over YouTube and Facebook. Having this capability is extending our reach. The number of people worshiping

in person plus the people watching online is greater than our average worship numbers when we were only in-person pre-Covid. Thank you for your financial support that has helped make this possible! Many thanks also to our tech people running the system on Sundays.

When this pandemic first began, we thought it might be half a year at most before being able to gather again like we did before the pandemic. Unfortunately, as groups of people ignore or deny the science and continue unsafe practices, the pandemic drags on with no sign of ending any time soon. It has been a very clear lesson that what we think are personal choices are very rarely solely personal. More often than not they are actually communal, affecting our neighbors close and far away. Jesus tells us to take care of our neighbors. I really miss our potlucks, thrift sales, Soup and Scripture nights, and other church fellowship times, and I pray that those times will be back as soon as possible. If we all work together, if we follow sound science and show neighborly love, we will get us to that day much more quickly. As I've said occasionally in vespers and in sermons, there are many things we have the right to do; but Jesus calls us to be more mindful about doing what is right. This is why your Leadership Team is being cautious and deliberate as we open our building and do the ministry we are called to do.

We continue to have a supply of cloth face masks thanks to our quilters—you may come to the office and get some, or send us a note and we can mail them to you.
