## **Treasurer's Report:**

Income for November was \$14,960.00. Expenses were \$11,655.84. Envelope income alone was \$11,910 due to the fact that some members have prepaid their pledges for 2021.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$8,546.33 Memorial Fund Balance: \$5,216.17 PPP loan: They are starting to accept forgiveness applications. RCU will email us when we can do so. (The norm is for loans under \$50,000 to be forgiven.)

- He will take vacation January 11–February 8. He expects we will have live worship on YouTube while he is gone. Jim Oliver has agreed to preach on two of the Sundays.

 Our nut sales this year earned us the usual amount of profit which is really good considering the circumstances.

#### **New Business:**

- The budget worksheet for 2021 was presented by Rob. Barb proposed a 4% increase in salary for Pastor David and Mimi. The motion was seconded and passed.
- We discussed how to handle the Annual Meeting (or lack of one). It was decided to mail out the proposed budget and slate of officers and ask members to vote by snail mail or email. The 2020 Annual Report will be printed in January and copies will be available for pick-up in the church office.

Meeting adjourned at 8:13. Our next meeting will be January 11 via Zoom.
