Our Moderator, Barb Kleist called the meeting to order at 7:02 P.M. Minutes of the April meeting were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

As of April 30, 2021 Year to Date Income \$39,330.40 Year to Date Expenses \$40,024.21 Ahead (Behind) \$693.81)

Treasurer's Report:

Envelope income for April was down \$9,000 from last year and \$4,000 from the previous 5-years average. Rob transferred \$7,000 from the Reserve Fund to help cover costs. All normal monthly bills were paid as well as OCWM, OCWM Special Supports, and Community Table.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$9,353.86

Memorial Fund Balance: \$8,317.67

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Pastor's Report:

- He will be on study leave May 17–23. Jim Oliver will preach May 23.
- John Stecher will fill in for Lynn on May 30.
- Pastor David is leading worship at Good Shepherd Apts every other month.

Old Business:

 There was discussion of how to spend our Creation Care grant. Cindy will make a schedule of what needs to be done and when.

New Business:

The Leadership Team set *tentative* dates for the fall Thrift Sale (September 18) and Bazaar (November 13)

Meeting adjourned at 7:50. Our next meeting will be June 14 in person at church.

We have been worshiping in-person for a few weeks, which has been great! It's so good to see you again and hear your voices without a laptop or a phone in between.

And recently the CDC announced that vaccinated people can be together just like before the pandemic - that was an exciting new report to hear! Our City Council and County Board have also both rescinded the mask mandates.

So we have decided that people joining us for worship who have been vaccinated can do so without masks or social distancing, and those not vaccinated yet we ask to please continue to wear

masks and socially distance in the area of the sanctuary we have set aside for social distancing. We also know that among those who are vaccinated, some might not be comfortable yet to go without masks. That is quite understandable, and we affirm that choice. No questions asked, and no shame or guilt, for anyone with a mask or without a mask. And for those who are not yet comfortable being with us in person, we will continue to livestream worship on Facebook and on our website (we will continue to do so after the pandemic as well - online worship is a new and welcome permanent feature of our ministry!).

Of course, we still want to wear our masks when out shopping and or in other enclosed public places until we have hit a critical mass of vaccinated people, but being able to see each others' faces in worship again feels like the most significant step forward we've had in a long time!

This news also means that potlucks are back - the first Sunday in June we will celebrate Communion and have a potluck after worship. It's been 16 months since our last one. I think we all look forward to breaking bread together again! I hope you will join us.
