You will find one of each container in the bistro area and kitchen. In the bathrooms you'll find a compostable one and a small



trash can. Our hand towels in the bathrooms are compostable. Any time you see a trash can with a green garbage bag in it, it will be for compostable items.

What is compostable?

- Paper Towels
- White napkins
- White and brown place mats
- Bathroom hand towels
- Food
- Plants or flowers
- Coffee grounds & filters
- Vacuum cleaner contents and dust pan sweepings
- Cotton and wool fabric scraps

Questions??? There is complete list on the refrigerator in the kitchen. There is also a recycling list on the refrigerator. If what you are throwing away doesn't appear on those two lists, it is trash.

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

With February comes Groundhog Day, Candlemas, Super Bowl Sunday, St. Valentine's Day, President's Day, and the whole month is Black History Month. Usually, it also includes Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, but this year Easter is quite late so Lent does not begin until March.

So I'll use this space to talk about some other happenings in our community that I've been involved with.

Day Center: A group of faith organizations and government agencies were able to get together late last year and put together a warming Day Center for people living on the streets. With the generosity of Christ Church Cathedral, which offered some of their space, we were able to put together a safe place for people to gather during the day when Sojourners is not open. We had it up in time for Christmas Weekend, and then New Years Day weekend, and going forward it is open just on Sundays. Sundays were chosen because the buses don't run on Sundays, and many businesses downtown are closed, so there are few options for the people living on the streets to find warmth on Sundays. Our hope is to eventually have it open every day, but that will require a lot more money and a permanent staff along with a lot more volunteers. For all the ugliness happening around us in the world, it is always good to be reminded that extraordinary acts of generosity and love are being done far more often than acts of evil. If you'd like to be involved, please talk to me. Spending time with people who live on the street can be a life-changing experience of meeting Jesus.

Afghan Refugees: Last fall, Wisconsin received about 13,000 Afghan refugees, and work is being done to resettle them. The Wisconsin Council of Churches, Lutheran Social Services, and other groups are helping in this effort. An ecumenical and interfaith group formed in Eau Claire to explore if we could welcome some families here. We decided that we could indeed do so, and are working toward that goal now! You may have seen the article in the Leader-Telegram or the news segment on WOOW. We hope to settle 3 to 5 families in the Chippewa Falls area. It's a faithful way to show love to our neighbors. We have recently found a rental home and funding, and are working on finding more. There will be calls out to the community with help in filling their homes with furniture, cooking supplies, bedding and towels, and all the other things that homes need. Many of our new neighbors fled Afghanistan with little more than the clothing they were wearing at the time. As needs arise, we will make announcements in church, on-line, and elsewhere. Jesus said that whenever we give food to the hungry, a drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, take care of the sick, or visit the prisoner, we are doing that to Jesus.

May we continue to be faithful to Jesus' way of love by taking care of our neighbors.

will also get an estimate for their replacement if that becomes necessary.

#### Pastor's Report:

 The Christmas Eve worship service went very well. David expressed his thanks for all of our talented musicians.

#### **Old Business:**

• Our new garbage service is working well. We still have some learning/education to do, but we're making good progress.

#### **New Business:**

- In light of the surge in Covid everywhere, it was decided to suspend coffee time on Sunday mornings for the time being.
- We also discussed keeping inperson worship or going virtual. The WI Council of Churches has recommended going to virtual worship. However, local health authorities have said that if masking and social distancing are done, indoor gatherings are okay. We will offer KN95 masks and close every other row of chairs in the sanctuary.
- Rob presented the proposed budget for 2022 and we discussed it, making one suggestion to reduce the advertising budget for the Leader-Telegram. The budget was approved by the Leadership Team along with a 4% raise for Pastor David, Lynn, and Mimi.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00. Our next meeting will be February 13, 2022 after worship.
