

Good News

Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Lent begins for us in March this year with Ash Wednesday on March 2. We will have worship that night with the imposition of ashes and celebrating Communion, as has been our tradition for a long time. During the Sundays of Lent, we will be taking our "wilderness journey" on the path to Easter. Seven weeks in which to look within ourselves, measure our discipleship, be honest about who we are and what we do well and where we need some improvement, and then make those changes. The observance of Lent is a tradition that goes way back to the early centuries of the Church. Many would count the Council of Nicea in the year 325 as the beginning of the tradition of observing Lent, though the idea of an Ash Wednesday beginning to Lent wouldn't come for a few hundred years. The start of Lent and some other details have changed over time, but it continues still to be a symbolic representation of Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness being tempted, and also a harkening back to the exodus out of Egypt, when the Hebrew people spent 40 years in the desert after achieving their freedom from Pharoah and before entering the Holy Land.

We will not have our usual Soup and Scriptures this year because of Covid, so I'll offer another way to mark the Lenten season for you. The Wisconsin Creation Care Team came across a wonderful 40-day Lenten devotional and practice focused on Earth stewardship and Creation Care. Since we have just become a Kairos Covenant Church of the Wisconsin Conference UCC, this seems a very sensible path, and I know many of you will enjoy this. We have a devotional packet, which is available on

our website (pcucc.com, follow the link at the top of the page; or you may follow the link at this explanatory page: https://www.wcucc.org/18035-2).

It contains a ritual of daily and evening prayer; a practice for a renewal; a children's storybook with coloring pages; a suggested random act of climate action, or a path you might take to show your solidarity and detachment from the systems that harm our world and therefore ourselves; a daily practice of creation examen (an ancient spiritual practice of gratitude); and a weekly spiritual practice of creation lectio divina (ancient spiritual practice).

I will be using this for the four evening Vespers I do each week (Monday through Thursday nights on Facebook). I suggest that you make use of it for your daily devotional time during your Lenten journey.

Worship:

• There will be in-person worship on Ash Wednesday, March 2 at 7:00 P.M. and on Maundy Thursday, April 14 at 7:00 P.M. However, there will not be "Soup and Scripture" on Wednesday nights during Lent this year (fingers crossed for next year!)

Building and Grounds:

- The faucets in both bathrooms are now working. Turns out they simply needed new batteries. Barb will consult a plumber to see if they can be adjusted so that they don't spray all over.
- Pastor David will work with Jeanny House to update the information on our website.

Pastor's Report:

- The funeral for Gloria Polden was well attended.
- He would like to take study leave May 16–22 to attend the Festival of Homiletics, and has asked to take a week of vacation May 9–15. We discussed who might fill in for him the two Sundays he's gone.

Old Business:

• We are hoping to start using the large monitors in the sanctuary the first Sunday in Lent.

New Business:

- The Team voted to reinstate coffee time on Sunday mornings and to open all seating in the sanctuary.
- The Northwest Association Annual Meeting will be held here April 23. Our hospitality duties will be minimal.
