This makes everyone feel safer and maybe we can get rid of COVID sooner. Even after you receive it, make sure you stay safe.

Please remember our homeless friends. Mike and his crew are out checking on the homeless to make sure they are okay. Please keep them in your prayers. They especially need donations of money, warm clothes, hats, gloves, anything that will keep them warm at this time. We have a drop off box at church and whatever is donated will be taken to Good Shepherd weekly. Also, don't forget our Birthday Challenge. We are challenging you to make a donation in your birthday month corresponding to your age. The money will be put toward future capital improvements, such as parking lot resurfacing. May birthdays, it's your turn! We have changed our garbage carrier and now have three types of trash cans. There's a regular trash can, a recycling trash can and a compost trash can. Each will be clearly marked with what can go in them.
