

Food for Thought


We also have LED light bulbs free for the taking. It's a program sponsored by Focus on Energy.

Dear Friends and Family of
Plymouth,

‘Tis fall and the beginning of the end of the year. In my mind, these three months of October, November, and December all form a single time-span; one that happens to be divided into three separately-named parts. The other months, in my mind, act as independent units. But there is something about these last three months that makes them feel like they’re telling a one-act play with three scenes. Maybe it’s because winter feels like it has its roots in October, beginning as a barely heard counter-point to the louder melody of fall, patiently crescendoing over the months like a slowly evolving symphony until it overpowers the autumnal song to reach a dramatic fortissimo mid-December that it holds into the new year.

Or maybe it’s the holidays. We have so many packed into that short time, after going for quite a long time with few of them. The church calendar, too, packs many special days into these three months. It’s a three-month-long celebration as the days shrink, the temperature drops, the snow piles up... maybe that’s why we pack so many holidays into that time—to distract us from what’s happening outside. Notice how summer doesn’t have anything other than Independence Day for us, and

nothing in the church calendar after Pentecost! Perhaps our ancestors were smarter than we give them credit for.

This period is not a time that I need to have distraction from the weather—in fact, I very much look forward to fall and winter—but I know that for most people, this is the beginning of a time of doldrums, seasonal affective disorder, and worries about walking/driving on ice and snow. If you do find yourself feeling some seasonal low spirits during this time, please reach out, and/or please don’t be afraid to seek out professional help if you need it.

There is no shame in it; in fact, it’s a strength to admit to needing some help and seeking it out. I can help you find it if you need, too. And as to snow/ice, we have people who will happily park your car or provide rides so you don’t have to walk on an icy parking lot, and who can help in other ways. I’ll say more about that once we get closer to our time of snow. We want to make sure everyone is taken care of as best as we can.

Our Moderator, Barb Kleist, called the meeting to order at 7:03 P.M. Minutes of the August meeting were reviewed and approved.

Financial Reports:

As of August 31, 2022

Year to Date Income	\$87,276.86
Year to Date Expenses	\$89,942.21
Ahead (Behind)	(\$2,665.35)

Treasurer's Report:

Envelope income continues to be higher than in years past. Regular bills were paid. Payments to OCWM and the Community Table will be made at a later date. It was decided to take \$20,000 from PIP to cover cash flow shortages for the rest of 2022.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$7,920.20

It was decided to make grant funds a separate line from the landscape line.

Reserve Fund Balance: \$3,451.78

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

- The prices for nuts this year will be: \$17 for a single, \$29 for a double, \$18 for single cashews, and \$30 for the 28 oz. tin.
- Fall stewardship letters will go out in November with pledges received December 4.

Building and Grounds:

- Glass for the door in the sanctuary is still back-ordered and will hopefully arrive for installation before winter comes.
- Our housekeeper has not submitted a bill for her services for some time. We have gifted her a \$100 Kwik Trip card.

Worship:

- Thanksgiving Eve worship will be at Plymouth this year. Deb and Barb will provide bars/cookies to serve following the service.
- Advent decorating will be done Wednesday, November 30 at 2:00 P.M.

Pastor's Report:

- He will be officiating at a funeral for the wife of a couple he married roughly 15 years ago. The husband's parents were long-time members of Plymouth.
- He and Lynn will be doing the worship serve at Good Shepherd apartments.
- The Conference and Camps have ongoing financial problems and will probably combine to become one entity. There is also the prospect that they will close the Conference office as most of the work is done remotely anyway.
- UCCI is hosting a retreat at Daycholah Center on November 4 and 5. It's called "Creation Care 101—Cross Pollination: Joining Hearts and Hands to Help Save the Earth"

Old Business:

- The "Little Library" seems to be very popular with the neighborhood. More books will need to be added. Deb has some fresh ones to contribute.
- On December 2–3, the Eau Claire Garden Club is doing a two-day instructional on "porch pots" in preparation for the holiday season. We will have a bake sale and include nuts for sale and some hand-crafted items as well.

Meeting adjourned at 7:51 P.M. There will be no meeting in October as Larry and Barb will be away. Our next meeting will be November 13, 2022 after worship.
