Dear Friends and Family of Plymouth,

Advent is upon us, and that also means that Christmas is around the corner.

Are you ready for Christmas? That question seems to be asked a lot, because we cram so much into our preparations that one could very easily NOT be ready for Christmas by the time it comes. Oh, no! I offer you some comforting news: 2000 years ago on the first Christmas no one was ready for it then, either. Not Mary or Joseph, and certainly not the world. Christmas is coming whether we are ready for it or not—so why not enjoy the sacred time that is the waiting time of Advent? Do whatever fills you with joy for the season and brings you meaning, but don't stress over anything that goes undone. We don't want to be so stressed making sure that we're "ready" that we utterly miss it when it comes. Let go of whatever is undone, because let's be honest: none of it is essential anyway. Christmas is going to happen even if there are zero choices of cookies, presents are unwrapped, or not every room is decorated. So be present to the happening.

We're talking about the sacred in this year's Advent services: sacred time, sacred space, sacred people, and sacred knowing. In so many ways, all that is around us and within us is sacred, for it is all born of God. But unless we slow down (sacred time), and allow ourselves time to see it, we will not notice that we are surrounded by sacredness. We need to engage in the spiritual practice of being silent, unbusy, and unproductive. We need those in order to do the work of discipleship of noticing the sacred.

How to do that? Something fun that could be a good spiritual discipline for you this Advent is to immerse yourself in scripture each day. Allow yourself the quiet, still, unbusy time of reading the story of Jesus and you might find yourself more able to notice the sacred around you.

The Gospel of Luke has 24 chapters in it—as many chapters as an Advent calendar has days. Starting on Dec. 1*, start reading a chapter a day and on Christmas Eve you will have read the entire gospel. You will have a better understanding of whose birth we're celebrating or have your understanding refreshed. If you also have an Advent calendar, do the two together. Read a chapter, and then open a door on the calendar.

Join your church family for worship, too, as we explore the sacred this season. And the "class" we're holding on the birth narratives (see elsewhere in the newsletter about this).

Have a meaningful Advent of noticing the sacred, and a very merry Christmas!



* Advent actually begins on Nov. 27 this year, so if you think you might miss a day or two of reading, you can start early and give yourself a few buffer days. Or you could read each of the 4 chapters of the book of Ruth Nov. 27–30, which is a story of one of Jesus' ancestors, Ruth, who is mentioned in Jesus' genealogy in Matthew. She is the great-grandmother of David. It's a beautiful story of friendship, dedication, and one of many stories in the Old Testament of an outsider/foreigner being used by God to do something important.



Advent Bible study opportunity

On the four Wednesdays during Advent we will show videos from the online class The Christmas Stories: Celebrating, Questioning, & Explaining the Biblical Narratives sponsored by the Homebrewed Christianity podcast. The course will be led by New Testament scholar John Dominic Crossan and is based on the book The First Christmas: What the Gospels Really Teach About Jesus's Birth, which he co-authored with Marcus J. Borg. There is no cost and the book is optional. We will meet on November 30, December 7, December 14, and December 21 at 3 P.M. in the sanctuary and will follow each video with discussion. For more information see George Stecher. (Note: We are decorating the sanctuary for Christmas on November 30 at 2 P.M., so we might start a little bit later on that date.)

Kwik Trip Scrip Change

As of November 1, 2022, Kwik Trip will no longer offer an additional 10% rebate on purchases inside the store when you use your scrip card. Instead, they will have separate "Grocery" cards at a 15% discount for us. These will be good only inside the store and may not be used for fuel, tobacco, alcohol, gift cards, lottery/lotto, or stamps.
