#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Year to date Envelope income is \$6,507 less than last year at this time, but \$16,818 over the average going back to 2009. There was a \$4,000 transfer from the Reserve Account. Annual Shepherd's Staff maintenance was paid. OCWM and Community Table will get caught up at the end of the third quarter.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$19,915.52

Reserve Fund Balance: \$35,459.66 \$30,000 was added from PIP and we received a stock gift that sold for \$6,557.29. We don't know yet who gave the stock, but Larry will try to find out for us.

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Building and Grounds:**

 Linda Oliver brought up the grass in the parking lot. It will be left to die out at the end of summer.
 Meanwhile, Larry will find out a ballpark cost for crack filling/

- resurfacing so we can determine if and when we have enough funds in the Contingency Fund
- Mimi will call again to get someone to fix the missing sprinkler head cover
