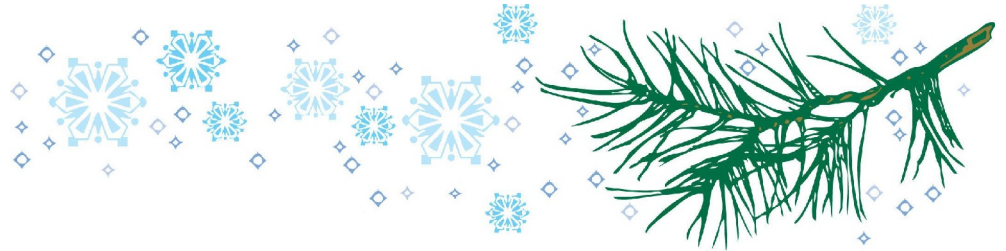

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and accepted.

Financial Reports:

As of November 30, 2023

Year to Date Income	\$121,297.05
Year to Date Expenses	\$131,437.07
Ahead (Behind)	(\$10,140.02)

Treasurer's Report:

Year to date Envelope income is \$7,145 less than last year at this time, but \$16,081 over the average going back to 2009. There was a \$3,500 transfer from the Reserve Account and \$2,853.81 profit from the 'Tis the Season sale. We will have to catch up OCWM and Community Table for the year end.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$19,607.12

Reserve Fund Balance: \$16,927.18

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Worship:

- We will "undecorate" on Wednesday, January 3 at 2:00 P.M.

Stewardship:

- A letter and pledge forms were mailed out December 1 along with contribution statements through November 26.

- Envelopes will be put in the bulletins for Dec 10 and 17 for folks to donate cash to the Christmas Food Drive

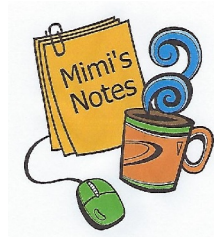
New Business:
