#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Year to date envelope giving is \$11,155 over last year at this time. Paid bills include building insurance, snow removal (last one of the season), and mowing (pine cone clean-up). Offerings for OCWM, OCWM Special Supports, and Community Table were disbursed.

**Memorial Fund Balance:** \$18,426.35

**Reserve Fund Balance:** \$10,447.68

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Stewardship:**

We are considering changing some
 of our checking accounts (Scrip,
 Memorial Fund, etc) from regular
 checking accounts to money market
 checking accounts to take advantage
 of the interest paid on them. Larry
 will get more detailed information
 from RCU and present it at the next
 meeting so that we can make an
 informed decision.

#### Worship:

Pentecost is May 19. Rev Bill
 Sprouse will be the guest preacher as Pastor David will still be on study leave.

#### **Building and Grounds:**

- A couple of the soap dispensers are leaking in both the men's and ladies' bathrooms. Larry will try to fix them.
- Larry will meet with someone from Senn to confirm details of their proposed work on our parking lot before we commit to their proposal.

- Barb shared some last-minute details of the Plant/Bake sale coming up May 18

You have perhaps noticed some more changes in our landscaping. Not only has spring come and brought with it the blooming of our beautiful crab-apple trees and lilacs and flowers, but our hard-working volunteers have been busy. In the past few weeks, they have spent a great many hours removing wild mustard, removing the tarps, putting down straw, planting Eco Grass (which doesn't need watering once it's established), a couple elderberry bushes (which will give us berries in a few

years!) and a very impressive 120 Red Osier Dogwood shrubs and making fences to put around each one to keep the animals from eating them. It's been a tremendous labor of love and dedication, so please take a moment to thank Cindy Halfen and her husband Jerry, and also Keith, Mike, and Bill who made this happen. The grass that was planted is now popping out, giving us some green in what has been barren. Many thanks to all our volunteers for your dedication and labor!
