The meeting was called to order at 11:39 A.M. The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and accepted.

Financial Reports:

As of July 31, 2024 Year to Date Income \$83,657.85 Year to Date Expenses \$86,195.01 Ahead (Behind) \$2,537.16)

Treasurer's Report:

Year to date envelope giving is \$7,204 over last year at this time and \$23,561 more than the average going back to 2009. \$7,375 was pulled from the Memorial Fund that was earmarked for General Fund. The quarterly building insurance premium was paid along with a plumbing repair. A sum of \$30,000 was transferred from PIP to the Reserve Fund (in August).

Memorial Fund Balance: \$14,017.47

Reserve Fund Balance: \$10,458.22

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

 We will no longer be selling nuts as a fund raiser. The owner of the company has passed away and his widow is closing the business. We'll be looking for ideas for a replacement fund raiser.

Worship:

- We will have a "Songs and S'mores" fellowship event on Wednesday, August 21 at 7:00 P.M.
- There will be a pot luck September 1.

Building and Grounds:

 Cindy Halfen and Keith Zehms have spent a lot of time and energy to get our landscape looking so nice

Pastor's Report:

- Pastor David will take vacation August 12–18.
- NW Clergy Retreat will be September 29–October 1 at Moon Beach.

Old Business:

- The libraries are being well looked after by Lil Savage and Linda Oliver
- Regarding Pastor David's sabbatical, we still have to fine tune our goals and work with him to decide on the beginning and end dates.

New Business:

• The Funeral Policy was updated and approved.
