

Welcome to 2025! I'm sitting here thinking about the year 1976. The United States was celebrating its bicentennial, I was 10 years old, and the future still felt very far away. Specifically the year 2000. I'm not sure why I was thinking about the year 2000 so much in 1976, but the distance of it—24 whole years! felt like it would never come. Now as we're moving into 2025, I realize we're farther from the year 2000 now than I was in 1976. And yet, the years leading to it felt like they lasted far, far longer than the years since. The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and accepted.

Financial Reports:

As of November 30, 2024 Year to Date Income \$136,459.86 Year to Date Expenses \$136,362.60 Ahead (Behind) \$97.26

Treasurer's Report:

Year to date envelope giving is \$7,874 over last year at this time and \$22,883 more than the average going back to 2009. \$7,000 was pulled from the Reserve Fund.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$5,172.34

Reserve Fund Balance: \$23,999.25

The financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

• Profit from the sale of nuts is nearly \$1000.

Worship:

- Christmas decorations will be taken down on Wednesday, January 8 at noon
- New led lights for the sanctuary Christmas tree were approved.

Building and Grounds:

• We need to secure the gate to the fencing that surrounds the HVAC equipment for the sanctuary.

Pastor's Report:

- Advent is going well and the decor looks good.
- Christmas Eve music is all set
- Sunday, Dec. 29 will be a carol sing, and we'll celebrate Epiphany January 5
- He would like us to consider joining JONAH

Old Business:

- The libraries are being well looked after by Linda Oliver
- Pastor David has us the dates for his sabbatical which are July 7 to September 29.

New Business:

- Working on the agenda for the Annual Meeting
- Regarding the proposed budget for 2025, we will increase the budget for pulpit supply and increase Pastor David's salary by 3% and Mimi's by 4%.
