Dear friends and family of Plymouth,

Usually I would be writing about Lent in this newsletter, but this year Easter is late—and we don't begin Lent until March 5! So in February we continue with our season of Epiphany, the season of light and revelation. The word "epiphany" means to "make known" or "to reveal," and relates to the wise men coming to visit Jesus with their gifts, and thus reveal to the world that the new King has been born. The star that the wise men saw revealed the birth to them, then they make that revelation to the rest of us. For us in the northern hemisphere, especially we who are near and above the 45th parallel, the season of light comes during some of the shortest days of the year when we have so much darkness and cold. We light the Epiphany candles and talk about the light of Christ as a reminder that the darkness and cold around us will end—spring is right around the corner!

One longstanding Epiphany tradition that comes from Europe is to mark with chalk the lintels of the doors of homes with the year and the letters C, M, and B in the pattern YY+C+M+B+YY, so this year it would be 20+C+M+B+25. (The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi: Caspar,

Melchior, and Balthasar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase Christus mansionem benedicat, "May Christ bless the house.") Then a prayer for the household is said. I will leave you with this prayer, asking that God bless you all this Epiphany season.

Peace be with this house and with all who live here. And peace be with all who enter here. During these days we keep this Feast of Epiphany, celebrating the manifestation of Christ to the Magi, and thereby to the whole world. Today, Christ is manifest to us! Today this home is a holy place



because of the presence of Christ here. O God, Lord of all that exists, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill each of us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
