# **Food for Thought**

Communion was held April 27. We will not have communion in May, but we will take our offering for the Community Table on May 4. Don't forget our special pot luck on May 4 to celebrate Pastor David's ministry with us and to say goodbye. Please let us know what you will be bringing. There's a sign up sheet at church or you can either call or email the church office or email Barb at bkleist04@gmail.com. The church will be providing hot ham and beef with gravy, but we need all the fixings. We will have guests besides us, so we're thinking around sixty people. Please let us know what you are bringing.



We are still recording our worship service to view on Facebook, for those who feel safer at home or can't make it to worship. COVID, RSV, and the flu are still around in our community. Masks are always available at church if you would like to wear one. Flu shots are still recommended this season! The COVID vacine is still available,

along with the RSV vaccine. The CDC is recommending you get a second COVID shot after six months.

Please don't forget our homeless friends. Mike and his crew are out checking on the homeless to make sure they are okay. Please keep them in your prayers. With federal funding being cut, there are very few options for the homeless. We have a collection box in the Gathering area for clothing, or else you can send a check to CVSM, PO Box 51, Eau Claire, WI 54702-0051. Here is a needs list from the Street Ministry: hooded sweatshirts, in larger sizes so that they can layer; sleeping bags and blankets; men's underwear—new is preferred in all sizes. Also, monetary gifts are very welcome. They purchase city bus passes to provide those that need transportation to work or appointments. Also if they need some items not donated, they have to purchase them.

Also, don't forget our Birthday Challenge. We are challenging you to make a donation in your birthday month corresponding to your age. The money will be put toward our next big repair project. May birthdays, it's your turn!

Come and visit our libraries. We have one curbside for anyone to use and we've started one inside in Fellowship Hall. Different books are added frequently.

If anyone knows of a family member or member of this congregation who is in the hospital, please let the church office know. Unless someone tells us, we don't know if you're in the hospital. The meeting was called to order at 11:45 A.M. The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed and accepted.

#### **Financial Reports:**

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Year to date envelope income is \$11,164 less than last year at this point, but \$20,102 more than the YTD average going back to 2009. Expenses included Association dues, the quarterly water bill, and HVAC maintenance. OCWM and Community Table payments will be caught up in April.

#### Memorial Fund Balance: \$6,413.08

#### Reserve Fund Balance: \$24,032.86

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

#### Worship:

- March 27 will be a communion Sunday and we will receive Marisa Johnson as a new member.
- May 4 (Pastor David's last Sunday as our pastor) we will have special music. There will be a Litany of Farewell at the end of the service.
- We are planning Farewell Luncheon following worship May 4. An invitation will go out to the congregation as well as special guests requested by Pastor David. We expect about 60 people and will purchase ham and beef with gravy and rolls. The rest of the meal will be pot luck style. Set-up for the meal will be done May 3 at 10 A.M.

#### **Building and Grounds:**

Our housekeeper has resigned due to health concerns. Lil is working to find a replacement. (We will have to do the cleaning for Easter and May 4.) We will present a thank-you gift to our departing housekeeper.

#### **Pastor's Report:**

- He would appreciate it if we would cover his healt/dental insurance for May. It was noted that perhaps the church in Hawaii will reimburse us for a portion of that. All other pastoral compensations will terminate on May 4.
- There will be an exit interview with the Leadership Team on April 25 at 1 P.M.
- He expressed sadness to leave us, but excitement for his new challenge.

At this point, Pastor David was excused from the meeting.

#### **New Business:**

- We reviewed the Minister in Residence contract and compensation package for Rev. Michael Jones. A motion was made and seconded to accept the contract. Motion passed. We need to make him aware of Lynn's part of worship planning. We will have to take a look at the scheduling for who is preaching when, etc. After the contract is signed by both parties, a letter will be sent to the congregation.
- Bill has been working on weekly transition devotions and will have them ready soon.
- We have been asked if we would like to have a booth at the Pride gathering. More info to come.

Meeting adjourned at 1:30 P.M. Our next meeting will be Sunday, May 18, 2025 after worship.
