Financial Reports:

As of September 30, 2025 Year to Date Income \$103,030.55 Year to Date Expenses \$100,101.83 Ahead (Behind) \$2,928.72

Treasurer's Report:

Year to date envelope income is \$73,619, \$7,266 less than last year at this point, but more than the YTD average going back to 2009. Income includes \$3,093 from the Thrift Sale. Expenses included bi-annual maintenance of the HVAC system by Hovland's and the quarterly water bill.

Memorial Fund Balance: \$9,195.56 **Reserve Fund Balance:** \$9,067.87

Financial reports were reviewed and accepted.

Stewardship:

- In mid-November Mimi will send out/email the stewardship letters and pledge forms
- We hope to order nuts for arrival before Thanksgiving.

Worship:

 We will have a pot luck following worship November 7 (All Souls' Sunday). Mimi will prepare the communion elements and order the white roses. Lil will handle the setup for the pot luck Advent decorating will happen
December 6 beginning at 10 A.M.
Lunch will be served, so we'll need
some soups, breads, and desserts for
that.

Building and Grounds:

- Larry brought in some silicone spray and the locks are not sticky any more.
- Larry also washed all the windows.
- An electrician was called to fix the light in the quilters' closet.

Pastor's Report:

• He is happy to be our pastor as long as he and his family are in Eau Claire. There is a possibility that his husband could be transferred to Chicago, but he won't know for a few weeks yet. If the transfer occurs, he will get everything set up for us to begin a search for his replacement.
