## The Service of the Word

### Psalm 93

- L: The Lord is king, he is robed in majesty; the Lord is robed, he is girded with strength.

### Gospel

Luke 24:44–53

Then he said to them, “These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.” Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, “Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God.

## The Response to the Word

### **Offering** *(You may send your offerings to the church, or drop them off in person.)*

During the offering, you might enjoy listening to Oliver Messiaen's "L'Ascension" (The Ascension), composed circa 1932–33. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=icCQu1FCtfQ&t=5s> Messiaen was one of the greatest organists of the 20th century, as well as a great composer of mystical, meditative music. L'Ascension was originally composed for orchestra, and then Messiaen created this organ version later. It's 20 minutes 14 seconds long, and quite beautiful. For something a little shorter, here is a 5-voice motet "Ascendit Deus" by Peter Philips (born in England in 1560 or 1561, and left England in 1582 because he was Catholic and England was growing more anti-catholic at that point), written in the early 1600s. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tjU9GdGt3NI>
