Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18

- L: O Lord, you have searched me and known me.
- P: You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away.
- L: You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways.
- P: Even before a word is on my tongue, O Lord, you know it completely.
- L: You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me.
- P: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.
- L: For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- P: I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made.
- L: Wonderful are your works; that I know very well.
- P: My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth.
- L: Your eyes beheld my unformed substance.
- P: In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed.
